THE FATRS ACT 1873 [36 and 37 Vict. cap. 37] Pinner Fair

Whereas representations have been made to me by the owner and by the Council of the London Borough of Harrow that a Fair, known as Pinner Fair, has been held annually in the London Borough of Harrow on the First Wednesday after Whit Sunday and that it would be for the convenience and advantage of the public that this fair should in future be held annually on the Wednesday next following the last Monday in May:

And Whereas notice of the said representations and of the time when the same would be taken into

consideration by me has been duly published in pursuance of the Fairs Act 1873:

And Whereas it appears to me after considering the said representations that it would be for the convenience and advantage of the public if the day on which the said Fair is used to be held were altered.

Now therefore I, the Right Honourable Reginald Maudling, MP, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, in exercise of the power conferred upon me by Section 6 of the Fairs Act 1873 do hereby order that the said Fair shall be held annually on the Wednesday next following the last Monday in May.
