

Dartmouth, July 19. On the seventeenth at Night her Majesty's Ships the Exeter and Winchelsea, with the crew of 1000, bound for Plymouth, were put back by contrary Winds, and put into Torbay; and this Day they sailed again from thence towards Plymouth; as did the Society of Guernsey, Capt. Cooper Commanded, out of this Port for New-England. Yesterday the Durca Convey with the Topham Packers, and the Vessels he joined them from hence, sailed from Torbay to the Eastward.

Yarmouth, July 20. This Day sailed out of our Road diversight Colliers for Newcastle. Her Majesty's Ships the Faulkstone and Advice's-Prize continue in our Road.

Bristol, July 20. Yesterday her Majesty's Ships the Hampshire and Hastings sailed a second time with above thirty Sail or Merchant-Ships bound for Ireland, the Straights, the West-Indies and Newfoundland. This day came in the Hope of and from Dram, Christian Green Master, who had a Month's Passage, in which time he saw but one Privateer. This day came in the St. Francis of and from Bilbao.

Cowes, July 20. Yesterday came in the two Brothers of and for Rotterdam with Wine and Brandy, with the late Fleet from the Downs. At Spithead is arrived the Oppert-Merchant of and for Boston, John Eabbage Master, from Amsterdam.

Portsmouth, July 21. Yesterday Admiral Baker, with the whole Fleet, arrived at St. Hellens, and weighed Anchor early this Morning; and are now under Sail to the Westward. The Names of the Men of War are the Starling-castle, Somerset, Pembroke, Resolution, Chatham, Lyn and Griffin Fireship. There are at Spithead her Majesty's Ships the Southampton, Dover, Strombulo and Lizzard.

Dorset, July 21. The Phoenix Transport is sailed for Portsmouth; here remain her Majesty's Ships the Restauration, Nottingham and Nonchuck. Eight Frigates, with the Betty of Dunce and Frisco-Gally, are still here.

Whereas Complaint hath been made to Her Majesty, that many People inhabiting in Towns and Villages where Marine Soldiers happen to be Quartered, do trust the said Soldiers for much more than their daily Subsistence doth amount to, in hopes of receiving the same out of their Pay; and that upon the Lord High-Admiral's giving his Orders for the said Soldiers marching from those Places, the Persons who trust them, as aforesaid, do stir them up to Mutiny for their Pay, and not to March until they have the same; several Instances whereof have happened, and one very lately, to the great Prejudice of the Queen's Service: Her Majesty is therefore pleased to Command, that no Person whatsoever do for the future presume to Trust any Soldiers belonging to the Marine Regiments, where they shall happen to be Quartered, for more than their daily Subsistence, which is six Pence. And Her Majesty is further pleased to Command, that this Notice be given to any Persons who shall presume to Trust them for more than is hereby directed, that if they do, on that pretence, or any other, stir up the said Soldiers to Mutiny, or not to Obey their Officers in Marching, according to such Orders as shall be from time to time given, they shall be Prosecuted with utmost Severity, and the Soldiers themselves taken up, tried, and punished as Mutineers.

Whereas a Letter dated the 27th of the last Month, and sign'd D. I. was sent by the Penny Post to Josiah Burchett, Esq; Secretary to the Right Honourable the Lord High-Admiral of Great Britain, &c. complaining of Irregularities committed by the Commander of one of her Majesty's Ships in America; these are therefore to give Notice, That if the Person who wrote the said Letter will attend his Lordship at the Admiralty-Office, and make good his Accusation, he shall have all fitting Encouragement and Protection.
