Malmesbury Rural District Council (Footpath Across O.S. No. 60 Lea) Public Path Diversion Order, 1972

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") made on the 27th March 1972, is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation or to be confirmed by the Malmesbury Rural District Council as an unopposed Order.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modification, will be to divert the public right of way being a length of Footpath from the junction of Footpath No. 5 and Footpath No. 6 leading easterly for approximately 53 yards across O.S. No. 60 to a line running southerly for approximately 20 yards from the junction of Footpaths No. 5 and No. 6, then easterly for approximately 56 yards and then northerly for approximately 36 yards to rejoin the existing Footpath approximately 53 yards east from the junction of Footpaths No. 5 and No. 6.
