Notice is hereby given that on the 4th January 1972 the Secretary of State for the Environment amended the above development plan.

The amendment becomes operative as from the 7th April 1972, but if any person aggrieved by it desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Town and Country Planning Act, 1962, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the making of the amendment he may, within six weeks from the 7th April 1972, make application to the High Court.

The amendment relates only to part of the proposals for alterations or additions submitted by the local planning authority which otherwise remain to be dealt with by the Secretary of State. The proposals dealt with in the amendment comprise the addition of the Royal Tunbridge Wells and Southborough Town Map.

*The Spilsby Rural District (Stickney) Public Path Diversion Order, 1972*

Notice is hereby given that the above Order made on the 27th March 1972, is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation, or to be confirmed, as an unopposed Order by the Council.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modifications, will be to divert the part of the Public

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Footpath No. 341 at Stickney, running from a point adjoining Hall Lane through Enclosure No. 266 on O.S. Lincolnshire (Parts of Lindsey) Sheet XC.10, Second Edition 1906, in a south-easterly direction for a distance of approximately 47 yards until it joins the line of the proposed alternative highway to a line which commences at a point adjoining Hall Lane approximately 20 yards eastwards of the above-mentioned point and continues in a southerly direction for a distance of approximately 42 yards, parallel with the western boundary of the accommodation roadway leading from Hall Lane to Enclosure No. 327 on O.S. Lincolnshire (Parts of Lindsey) Sheet XC.10, Second Edition 1906, until it joins the existing Footpath No. 341.

A copy of the Order and the map contained in it has been deposited at and may be inspected free of charge at the Spilsby Rural District Council's Offices, Toynton Hall, Spilsby, between 9 a.m. and 5.30 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays.

*Worthing Rural District Council part of Public Footpath No. 2176 at Angmering Diversion Order, 1972.*

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") made on the 11th April 1972 is about to be confirmed by the Worthing Rural District Council as an unopposed Order.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modification, will be to divert part of public footpath No. 2176 at Angmering which part begins at a point in the north-west corner of field No. O.S. 337 at Angmering and runs at an undefined width south-eastwards for approximately 820 feet to a line commencing at a point in the north-west corner of field O.S. 337 at Angmering and runs southwards at a minimum width of 6 feet for approximately 760 feet and thence eastwards at a minimum width of 6 feet for approximately 260 feet.
