NOTICE OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER

Halstead Rural District Council Footpaths Nos. 8 (Great Yeldham) and 32 (Toppesfield) Public Path Diversion Order, 1972.

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") made on the 29th March 1972, is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation, or to be confirmed, as an unopposed Order, by the Halstead Rural District Council.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modifications, will be:

- (i) to divert a length of the public right of way (being Footpath No. 8 in the parish of Great Yeldham), running from the point at which it crosses the former Halstead—Haverhill railway line south-east of Manscross Farm, in a south-easterly direction for a distance of approximately 350 yards to a point situated on the northern boundary of field O.S. 4339, to a new route running from the said crossing point, along the former railway route in a south-easterly direction for a distance of approximately 495 yards and thence, following an existing farm road, in a westerly direction for a distance of approximately 190 yards to rejoin the existing route of Footpath No. 8 in field O.S. 4339.
- (ii) to divert a length of the public right of way (being Footpath No. 8 in the parish of Great Yeldham) running from a point on the northern boundary of field O.S. 4339 in a southerly direction for a distance of approximately 430 yards to its junction with Footpath No. 10 in field O.S. 6423 to a new route running in a south-westerly direction along the western boundary of fields O.S. 4339 and 3516 for a distance of approximately 530 yards to a point situated in the south-west corner of field O.S. 2697 and thence in a south-easterly direction along the boundary of the said field O.S. 2697 for a distance of approximately 95 yards to rejoin Footpath No. 10 in the north-western corner of field O.S. 3980.
- (iii) to divert a length of the public right of way (being Footpath No. 32 in the parish of Toppesfield) running from a point situated on the north-eastern boundary of field O.S. 2082 in a south-westerly direction for a distance of approximately 200 yards to a point on the north-western boundary of the said field to a new route running from a point situated in the northern corner of field O.S. 2082 in a generally south-westerly direction along the northern boundary of field O.S. 2082 for a distance of approximately 185 yards to rejoin the existing route of Footpath No. 32 at the said point on the north-western boundary of field O.S. 2082.

A copy of the Order and the map contained in it has been deposited and may be inspected free of charge at the offices of the Halstead Rural District Council, Mount Hill, Halstead, Essex, between the hours of 9 a.m. and 1 p.m. and 2 p.m. and 5.30 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays inclusive.

Any representation or objection with respect to the Order may be sent in writing to the Clerk of the Halstead Rural District Council at Council Offices, Mount Hill, Halstead, Essex, not later than the 19th May 1972, and should state the grounds on which it is made.

If no representations or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn, the Halstead Rural District Council may, instead of submitting the Order to the Secretary of State for the Environment, themselves confirm the Order. If the Order is sub-

mitted to the Secretary of State any representations and objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be transmitted with the Order.
