

nection with the above-mentioned Scheme and Orders.

The said Scheme would, if made,

- (a) provide that the road which the Secretary of State proposes to construct for the exclusive use of traffic of Classes I and II of the classes of traffic set out in Schedule 4 to the Highways Act 1959 (as amended) will be a special road about 14.29 kilometres in length between Capel Llanilltarn in the County of Glamorgan and Pencoed in the said County;
- (b) provide 8 special roads as connecting roads between the above-mentioned Special Road and the proposed new link road to Llantrisant and the proposed Pencoed By-pass, and
- (c) provide for the special roads to become trunk roads as from the date when the Scheme comes into operation.

The first said Order would, if made, authorise the Secretary of State:

1. (a) to improve, raise, lower or otherwise alter highways;
- (b) stop up highways;
- (c) to construct new highways;
- (d) to stop up private means of access to premises, and
- (e) to provide new private means of access to premises;

all in the vicinity of the above-mentioned special roads, and

2. provide for the transfer of each of the the said new highways to the County Council of Glamorgan as from 1st April next after the date on which the Secretary of State notifies that authority that the new highways have been completed and are open for through traffic.

The second said Order would, if made, authorise the Secretary of State to purchase compulsorily—

- (a) the land and rights described in Schedule 1 thereof for the purpose of:
 - (i) the construction of new special roads in the Parishes of Coychurch Lower, Pencoed, St. Mary Hill, Llanilid, Llansannor, Llanharry, Llantrisant, Pendoylan, Peterston-Super-Ely and Llanilltarn in the County of Glamorgan in pursuance of the M.4 Motorway (Capel Llanilltarn to Pencoed Section) and Connecting Roads Scheme 197;
 - (ii) the construction and improvement of highways and the provision of new means of access in the said Parishes in pursuance of the M4 Motorway (Capel Llanilltarn to Pencoed Section) and Connecting Roads (Side Roads) Order 197;
 - (iii) the diversion of watercourses and the execution of other works on watercourses in the said County in connection with the construction of special roads, the construction and improvement of other highways and the execution of other works mentioned in the foregoing subparagraphs; and
 - (iv) use by the Secretary of State in connection with such construction and improvement of highways and such execution of other works as aforesaid.
- (b) the land described in Schedule 2 hereto for the purpose of the provision of a maintenance compound in connection with the special road at Pencoed in the said County.
