Errers from Lions fay, that a Barralion of Courten had been again defeat doy the Inhabitants of the Viver 23 every Day. They are now divided into two Bodies; but have so posted themselves, that they can easily join whenever they see occasion. They write from Besançon, that several Persons had been arrested there, on Suspicion of being concerned in the defige of betraying that Place, and that two Regiments of Dragoons and three Battalions were fent into the City for its better Security. These Letters add, that the Miseries of the People in Burgundy were so great, that they were apprehensive of an I furrection in that Country. Advices from Savoy of the eighte rith Infant fay, the greater part of his Royal Highness's Army was advanced as far as Termignon near Lanebourg. The Count de Medavi is entrenched at St. John, to prevent the Count de Taun from penetrating into the Maurienne.

General Rhebinder hath possessed himself of Mount General Rhebinder hath possessed himself of Mount General with ten thousand Men; and the Duke of Berwick it seemed on the other side of that Mountain, in order toxiver Briangon. Letters from Turin of the thirreenth Infant fay, that his Royal Highness was preparing to set out for Orbassan, and that his Forces were so far advanced towards the Frontiers, that they shortly expected an account of some considerable Action.

Prantfort, July 24. N. S. The Grand Master of the Thronick Order seturned hither yesterday from Darm Rade. He has received the Compliments of the Magifirscy of this City, upon the occasion of his being rescued out of the Hands of the French Party. The Elector Palitime has given a Jewel of the value of a inoutand Floring to the Chryslier Walpolt, for his figual Service in politing himself to conveniently on the Passages on the Rhines that the faciny which fixed the Grand Mafter tel into his Handa and loft all the Booty with which they wife returning to their Camp. To Morrow Te Deum will be Sung in the Church of the Teutonick O.der, for the Deliverance of the Grand Master. The Deputies of the Circle of the Upper Rhine are affembled in this Place, and the Count de Rechteren has presented to them a Memorial, wherein he has laid before them the absolute Ne-effity that the Circles of Swabia, Franconia, and the Electorates of the Rhine, should enter into a more strict Alliance for their Common Safety; and that they should hold a continual Sellion by their Deputies, either at this I ace or Heilbron. We hear that his Electoral Highness is expetted every Day at the Imperial Army which lies at Muhlberg. It is faid the Elector has funt Orders to General Thungen, who commands in chief in the absence of his Highness, that all things may be in a readiness for the Execution of some important Delign upon his arrival. Prince Alexander of Wirtemberg, who conmands at Landau, lately detached a confiderable Parry into the Enemies Country, who have deteated a Body of the French, and thrown down feveral Redoubts on the Lines of Lauter. At the same time Advices from the Enemies Army fay, that the Detachment of eleven Battallons and eighteen Squadrons which peffed the Rhine near Altenheim, continued to Forage the Country, and

to cut down the Corn, in order to find it into their own-Magazines. They write from Bohemia, that the Danish Troops in Hungary were on their March towards Saxo-

Bruffels, July 29. N. S. Letters from Madrid of the ninth Infant fay, that the Duke of Anjou having made new Dipolitions for carrying on the War with Vigour, has demanded of the Chrgy a Loan of five Millions, to enable him to put his Deligns in execution. The Deputing of the Chron had that Affair in Deliberation and the ties of the Clergy had that Affair in Deliberation, and itveral Prelateschad already paid in large Sums out of their own Revenues. In order to Supply the want of fuch Troops are recalled into France, twenty two new Battalions are to be raised, each confisting of five hundred and firty Men; at the same time it is thought fit to add ten Men to each Company which is already in the Pay and Service of the Court of Madrid. They write, that these Levies are very far advanced; and that several other Regiments are to be raised in Navarre. Biscay and Galiciat infomuch that it is reported the Duke of Anjon will have in his Service next Campaign forty five thousand Spaniards, and fourteen thousand French as Auxiliary Troops. The Count of Puebla, after having lately succoured the Cassile of Venasca with a Detachment of five thousand of the Contederate Forces made himfelt Master of feveral Neighbouring Posts, and returned to Caralonia. The Count de Bezons was thereupon obliged to derach four thousand Mentewards Moncon, to cover Arragon on that fide. The Marquis de Eay has abandoned the Blockade of Oliver on and toth Armies have marched into Quarters of Reinchiment. A late Account, wherein it was faid that the Spaniards had defeated two Battalions of the Portugueze, is contradicted by our last Advices: These add allow that the Portuguese happeners and a far as B.ozas, and obliged the Country to pay Contributions.

The next Day arrived a Dane bound for Lisbon. This Day came in a Dane with Deals for a Market, and a Swede for 5t. Ubes. Sailed a Dutch Privateer to Cruise, and a Dutch Guiney Man for Holland.

Darimouth, July 24, This Day came in here a Dane from Dunkirk in Ballafterbound for St. Martins; the Matter reports, that the Soldiers are in great Mistery for want of Bread. There is now a great Fleet of Ship's feen off Torbay, flanding to the Wellward, Which is supposed to be the Fleet from Portsmouth.
