Column 1 Length and sides of lengths of road restricted

(1) Swinegate (a) North side

From the western end of 43 Swinegate eastwards into The Hourne and up to the School a distance of 78 metres or 257 feet.

(b) South side

From the western boundary of 30 Swinegate eastwards of 64 Eastgate up to a point opposite the eastern boundary of 64 Eastgate a distance of 82 metres or 270 feet.

(ii) The Hourne East side

From the School in a southerly direction and then eastwards into Eastgate up to and including 64 Eastgate a distance of 52 metres or 170 feet.

- (iii) Eastgate (a) Both sides

At the acute bend from the corner of 47 Eastgate westwards and southwards for a distance of 6 metres or 20 feet.
