THE Right Honourable the Lord-Lieutenant and Council of Ireland having, in an humble Address to Her Majesty, requested, that as many of the poor Palatines as her Majesty shall think sir, may be fertled in that Kingdom, and given Assurances that they shall be very kindly received and advantagiously settled there: And that Address having been laid before the Right Honourable the Lords and others, her Majesty's Commisfigurers for receiving and disposing or the Mony to be collected for the Subfiftance and Settlement of the faid Palatines: The faid Commissioners have this Day resolved, that five hundred Families of the faid Palatines be forthwith fent into that Kingdom, and referred it to their Committee, to fettle the Mannor and Time of fending

them thither.

By Order of the faid Commissioners, Notice is hereby likewife given, that all Ministers, Church-wardens and other ful flancial Inhabitants of the feveral Parishes within the Chies of London and Westminster, and Bills of Mortality, who are concerned in the collecting the Mony on the Brief, for the Subliftance and Settlement of the poor Palatines, are hereby required, as foon as they have finished the Coll-Clions on the faid Briefs, to return the fame, together with the Mony thereon by them respectively col-lected, into the Chamber of London; and that the Receipt of the proper Officer there, appointed by the Chamberlain to receive the fame, shall be a sufficient Discharge to them respectively for their so doing.

Notice is hereby alfogiven, that all Masters of Ships or any other Persons, are at full Liberty to impley in their Service any of the Palatines that are willing to serve them; and that any Person who is willing to imploy any of them, may apply himself to Mr. Carter at Morris's Booth on Black heath.

A Genoese Vessel is arrived here, the Master of which reports, that he had failed in Comthe Matter of which reports, that he had latted in Company with a Squadron of British and Dutch Men of War to Barcelona; and from thence (being joined by other Ships of the same Nations) rowards Toulon. He says that Fleet had in it twenty four Sail of the Line of Battel, and that the greater Vessels had manned and sent the Shape to sair some Boats had manned and fent off Shape to sair some Boats had manned. off Sloops to seize some Boars near the Town. This Attempt alarmed the whole Cooft, and Signals were given from the Shoar, to give fuch finall Craft as were out at Sea Intelligence that the Enemy was in the Road. A Felucca which is lately arrived from Marfeilles, brings Advice, that the Governor of Provence had taken into his Cultody the greater part of the Corn of that Country for the Sublistance of the Army, which had reduced the Inhabitants to the utmost Misery. Several other Vessels from these Parts assure us, that the Allies continue to cruize near Toulon, in order to invercept all fuch Vesfels as shall attempt to carry Corn into France from Neutral Nations. The last Letters from Barcelona advise, that the Army of his Catholick Majesty was marched towards Lerida, and had made a Derachment which advanced towards the Lampourdan. The fame Letters add, that a French Ship of thirty Guns loaden with Corn was brought into Barcelona, and that another French Ship with the same Lading had fallen in with two Felucca's of Lippari. The Felucca's feixed the Corn, but fet the Ship at Liberty. Two Brirish Men of War, the Colchester and Bedford, set sail from hence yesterday to Barcelona. They write from Rome, that the Departure of the Marquis de Prie from thence was still deferred, and that

it was doubted whether his Delign of going at all was not laid efide. They edd, that the Accommodation between the Cours of Rome and Vienna was looked upon as wholly concluded, and that the Imperialits had offered to furrender Commachio upon Payment of forty thousand Pistoles.

A Journal of the Motions of the Imperial Army in Hunga-ry, under the Command of General Heister, from the 25th of June to the 6th of July, N. S.

On the twenty fifth of the last Month the Army advanced from the Neighbourhood of Kerment, and took on that Day feveral Prisoners, who gave an account that Count Esterhasi having received Advice of our March, had repassed the Raab with much Precipitation at the head of three Regiments and his Artillery, and had moved towards Schimeck. Upon this Intelligence General Hei-fter commanded the Count of Trent to march with three hundred Horse towards the Raab near St. Gottard, in order to reinsorce the Count of Breiner. The Count of Croy was at the same time detached with one thousand Horse towards Kensingh. with Orders to pursue the three Regiments which had repassed the Raab, and attack them-On the twenty fixth the Count de Croy came up with that Party of the Enemy in the Village of Minzent, and affaulted them with to much Vigour, that he killed three hundred on the Place, and put all the refe to Flight, excopt some few who were made Prisoners of War. In this Dispute ten Colours were taken from the Enemy? As foon as Intelligence of what had passed was brought to the Camp, leveral Parties, each of one hundred Men, were detached with Orders to ford the River, and purfue the Enemy in their Flight. Colonel Schilling was fent out ar the same time, at the head of five hundred Horse, into the middle of the Country. Another Detachment of the same Force was ordered to march towards Edenbourg, to prevent all Possibility of the Enemies Escape. There were above fifty Prisoners brought into the Camp the fame Evening, who all agreed in an Account, that the Enemy had marched further up into the Country. On the twenty feventh the whole Army came to Kovackzi, where the heavy Baggage arrived the Day be-fore, the Infantry having halted at Scharwar. The Parties which were employed in the Pursuit, report, that there was no body of Malecontents in the whole Country, except a Party of one hundred and fifty Men under the Command of the Partizan Barbir. A Detachment received immediately Orders to march in fearch of him. On the twenty ninth the Deputies of Edenbourg and Eisenfladt were summoned to meet, in order to settle the Dispolition of Civil and Military Affairs during the Stay of the Army in those Parts. On the thirtieth a Convoy of Provisions was fent to Scharwar, under the Convoy of two hundred Men, which returned this Day. At the fame, time Colonel Schilling came into the Camp with his Detachment, after having differfed and killed feveral Parties of the Enemy. On the first of July the Sieur Widerfperg was fent towards Edenbourg with two hundred Horie to convoy some Provisions. That Officer having met with the Fartizan Barbir, put him to Flight, killed several or his Men, and took twenty five Horses. one of our Serjeants, and four Soldiers, being left behind in the Village, were taken Priloners by the Enemy. On the fame Night the Baron Desfeigni was fent with one hundred and twenty Horse towards St. Gottard to confer with the Baron de Nehm. On the second, the Army marched from Nigy Senney, from whence the Baron of Neutleen was decaded with fires hundred. Neusteen was detached with three hundred Horse to reinforce the Sieur de Widersperg. On the third we encamp-
