1.ft Night, our Men began to work again upon the Ap proaches to the Cittadel: Count Lottum continues in the Command of his Attack, and has under him four Lieutenants-General, tour Majors-General, and as many Brigidiers, with thirty Battalions and ten Equadrons, including the Garrison of the Town; and the Dispositions are m.king for a fecond Attack. Upon the Enemies reviring into the Circadel a great number of their Men concealed themselves in the Town, among whom were two Captains, four Lieurenants, and one hundred and firty private Soldiers, who appeared this Morning at the Duke of Marlborough's Quarters. The new Lines of Circumvallation about the Cittadel are almost finished, and Orders given for levelling those about the Town. This Morning a Detachmento, two hundred Imperial Huffars, and a nundred Dragoons, ther were fent out to get Intelligence of the Enemy, tell in with four buildred of their Horie, and a hundred Granadiers, commanded by a Brigadier, being part of the Guard appointed to cover their Forage, whom they entirely dereated, killed a great number, and took a Major, ihrrieen other Officers, one hundred and twenty private Min. who with a hundred and fourfcore Horses, are all brought into the Camp. The Enemy continue to work in their Lines, to cover Could and Valencienne ; out we hear the Marefebal de Villars feut back yellarizy part of his Troops to those or la Baffer.
