THE Right Honourable the Lord-Lieutenant and Council of Ireland having, in an hamble Address to Her Majesty, requested, that as many of the poor Palatines as her Majerty shall think fit, may be set-tled in that Kingdom, and given Assurances that they shall be very kindly received and advantagiously fettled there: And that Address having been laid before the Right Honourable the Lords and others, her Majesty's Commisfioners for receiving and disposing of the Mony to be collected for the Sublistance and Settlement of the said Palatines: The faid Commissioners have this Day resolved, that five hundred Families of the faid Palarines be for hwith sent into that Kingdom, and referred it to their Committee, to fettle the Manner and Time of fending them thither

Notice is hereby likewife given, that the faid Commiffioners having determined to fend the fold Palatines with their Goods to Ireland by way of Cheffer, they will al. low Seven Shillings for Carriage of every hundred weight to Chest r, and will be ready every Day at their Committee, to contract with any Persons that are willing to be emplored in carrying the same.

Notice is hereby alfogiven, that all Masters of Ships or any other Persons, are at sull Liberty to imploy in their Service any of the Palarines that are willing to serve them; and thit any Person who is willing to imploy any of them, may apply himself to Mr. Carter at Morris's Booth on Black-heath; or to Mr. John Crokatt at the Butcher's Arms in Camberwell.

Vienna, July 24 N. S. Letters from Hungary advilethat General Heifter having retaken Scheimeck from the Malecontents, was encamped with his Army at Scharwar; from whence he fends frequent Detachments of his Cavalry to diffurb and incommode the Enemy, who continue to burn and pillage the Country whereever they come. The Imperial Troops which were posted at Leveniz retired from that Place, on the approach of Prince Ragotski with the main Body of his Army. General de Croix, who is encaraped with a Body at Altenbourg, will speedily be in motion to join General Hei-ster; after which it is hoped he will be in a condition to undertake forme Enterprize of importance. We

have received Advice, that twen y five Villages of the Malecontents have lately submitted thems was to his Imperial Maj fty; and that they have p'undered the Country, and destroyed the Habitations of those who continue in the Interest of Prince Ragorski Count Hannibal Heifter is fer at Liberty, after having been three Yearsa P ifoner of the Malecontents; as the same time several of their principal Officers, who were the Emperors Prifoners, obtained their Enlargement. We have received Advices, that there has lately happened a great Fire at Oimutz in Moravia. which had almost reduced that Place to Ashes. Count Traun, an Imperial Commissary, is lately returned from the Diet of the States of Hungary, af sembled at Presbourg, and has brought with him the Answer of the States of that Kingdom to the last Resolution of the Emperor concerning the Redress of their Grievances. It is said the Deputies are much divided in their Opinions, some demanding a more ampl- Satisfaction than that to which his Imperial Majesty has condescended; others relying upon the Emperor's Promise, that all things shall be settled according to their Expectation as soon as the posture of Affairs will permir. They add, that there are no less Difficulties on the Account of Religion, the Roman Clergy having discovered great uneaf-ness at the Emperor's Promise, that no Person shall suf-fer any molestation on account of his Faith; and infift, that it should be declared, that the Protestants shall not enjoy the same Privileges as the Roman Catholicks; or at kast, that fuch Freedom as shall be allowed to the former, shall depend upon the Will and Discretion of the respective Governors, or Lords of the Country, by whom they shall be liable to be banished from, or suffered to remain within their Jurisdictions, as such respective Governors or Lords shall think fit. On the other side, the Protestants inlist on their Rights with great Constancy, which has occasioned violent Animosities between them and the Ecclesiasticks, the latter being supported by many of the Deputies of their own Religion. The Act for the Confication of the Estates of such Hungarians as shall consinue in Arms is fear back hither, in order to receive forme Concessions from the Emperor in favour of those Malecontents, after which it will be returned for the Approbation of the Diet. The Danish Troops which are in Hungary have Orders to begin their March to morrow towards Saxony. The Infantry are to pass through Moravia, and the Horse through Austria. The Pestilence, which rages at Buda and Alba Regalis, has occasioned very severe Orders against any Commerce with those Places.

Frankfors, July 31. N. S. The Prince of Nieubourg.

Grand Master of the Teuronick Order, set our yesterday on his Journey to Duffeldorp, General Thungen hath received Orders from his Imperial Majesty to act offenfively against the Enemy, who by reason of the great Detachments sent into Flanders, are much interior to us in Number. Hercupon that General fent an Express to the Elector of Hanover, to desire him to basten his departure for the Army; and we hear that his Electoral Highnels hath fixed on the fifth of August to begin his Journey for this Place, and he is expected here within eight Days. We are affured, that on the arrival or his Highness the Imperial Army will pass the Rhine, to force the Enemies Lines on the Lauter, for which purpose General Thungen hath already caused Bridges to be laid over that River near Schrech. The Enemy have affembled all the Forces they had in Alfatia behind those Lines. The Prince of Wirtemberg, Governor of Landau, hath vifited the Lines which the French. have cast up near Weissenbourg; he found there many Redoubts, but most of them defenceless for want of Men. which confirms the repeated Advices we have received
