*North Shropshire Rural District Council (Footpath Numbers 12, 15 and 64 Ash) Public Path Diversion Order (No. 1), 1972.*

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order, made on 17th May 1972, is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation or to be confirmed, as an unopposed Order, by the North Shropshire Rural District Council.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modifications will be:

(a) To divert the public right of way, known as Footpath number 12, Ash running from the stile in the eastern most corner of field number 427 to its point of contact with Footpath number 64 Ash to a line running from a point on the south-western boundary of field number 428 following and just inside that boundary to its junction with the unclassified highway some 233 yards west-south-west of the property known as Ashwood Cottages shown on the O.S.1 for Shropshire Numbers VIII.2 and VIII.6 1926 Edition;

(b) To divert the public right of way, known as Footpath number 15, Ash running from its junction with the unclassified highway approximately 162 yards north-east of Wood Farm in a northerly direction to a point on the northern most corner of field number 458 on the Ordnance Survey map Sheet Numbers Salop VIII.2 and VIII.6 1926 Edition to a line running from the same point on the south-eastern boundary of field number 455 in field numbers 455, 450, 427 and 458 following and just inside the boundary fences between those fields as indicated on the aforementioned Ordnance Survey Map Sheet Numbers until it rejoins the existing route of public footpath number 15, Ash at the northern most corner of field number 458, Ash;

(c) To divert the public right of way, known as Footpath number 64, Ash running from a point on the south-eastern boundary of field number 428 abutting the unclassified highway approximately 55 yards west of Ashwood Cottages in a generally north-easterly direction across field numbers 428, 429, 393, 387 and 388 to a point on the south-eastern boundary of field number 388 on the Ordnance Survey Sheet Numbers Salop VIII.2 and VIII.6 1926 Edition to a line running from a point in the south-eastern corner of field number 428 abutting the unclassified highway approximately 23 yards west of Ashwood Cottages in the same fields as the existing path but generally alongside the boundary fences of those fields until it rejoins the existing route of public footpath number 64, Ash at the south-eastern boundary of field number 388 Ash.

A copy of the Order and the map contained in it has been deposited and may be inspected free of charge at the Council Offices, New Street, Wem, Shropshire, between the hours of 9 a.m. and 12.30 p.m. and 1.30 p.m. and 5.30 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays inclusive.

Any representations or objections with respect to the Order may be sent in writing to the Clerk of the North Shropshire Rural District Council, Council Offices, New Street, Wem, Shropshire, SY4 5DB, before the 7th day of July 1972, and should state the grounds on which it is made.

If no representations or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn, the North Shropshire Rural District Council may instead of submitting the Order to the Secretary of State for the Environment, themselves, confirm the Order. If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State any representations and objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be transmitted with the Order.
