His last week failed hence leveral vessels bound to the Westward. On Friday it blowing hard a great ftorm, put in here one Dutch ship from Middlebourg, bound for Lisbonne, and one French vessel from Havre de Grace, bound

Malaga, Mart. 4. This last week put in here a Dutch man of war in his way from Marfeilles, telling us, that a Dutch Flyboat was stopped in the Port for refusing to deliver up two French men which had been long entertained by them on board the ship.

Eleven French Saichs are faid to be now at *Algiers*, carrying thither the Turks and Moors, which had been taken upon feveral occasions, upon the late peace concluded between France and Algier.

Here is now in Port the *Pearl* Fregat, who fome days fince left the *Portfmouth*, *Forefight*, and *Orange*, with two Merchants thips off from *Alecant*, who tis supposed have been fince deteined by contrary winds.

Yesterday a Turk's man of war put three Portugues on shoar, about three Leagues distant from this place. Several ships are arming out to sea from Algier.

Since the Dicease of the Marquis d'Aytona, the Queen Regent has been pleased to confer the Charge of Great Master or Major domo upon the Duke de Infantados and the vacant Charge in the Councilupon the Constable of Cassier, his third Employment as Colonel of the late established Guards is not yet dispofed of, no perfon appearing over follicitous for that Charge, which is not over pleasing to the Generallity, some Endeavours being used for the Reforming of that Regiment.

The Erench Ambaffadour, Monlieur de Bonzi Arch-Bishop of Thouloufe is Honourably treated here by his Catholick Majesties Officers in the Palace furnisht and allotted for him by the Queen, but makes not his publick Entry till the arrival of his baggage which came by sea, and is landed at Alecant.

The Count Herman de Nunez designed for the Court of Foland, to Compliment their Majesties upon their Marrage, attendsonly for the present of Jewels, which the Queen Regent has designed for the Queen of Poland, to the value of 200 thousand Crowns.

The Cardinal de Porto Garrero is supposed to be now well advanced on his journey for Rome, which he for fome time recarded till he had received 10000. Copenhagen, March 13. The Deputies from the Counlel of Holftein have complained to the King of Demmark of the Sieur Gabel, and attributed to him the want of agreement (as to the difputed County.) The Deputies from Ditmarch leem allo to direct their complaints against the faid Gabel, for violating the priviledges granted them by King⁴ Frederick II. in preferring Officers to govern them which were not Natives.

The King has been pleafed to confirm all those performs in their employments which were fent to foreign Princes by the King his Father, and has ordered new instructions to be fent them.

In the mean time demand leave to raile 4000 men out of their own nation, upon the expences of the Emperour and the States of Hungary, to be placed in Garrison in the frontier Towns in the room of the Germans f that the Polish Money, and all other of mixt mettals be called in : shat their grievances in point of Religion be redreffed : and that the Levant Company establisht in Germany be suppress, as rutnous to the Trade of Hungary.

Bruffeld, April 4. We have had a warm rumour of fome treafonable praetices difcovered at Ayre in Aytois, but we fufpend the belief thereof till farther confirmation.

Count Marfin was expected here on Monday laft, but his return is now prevented, fresh Orders being fent to him to leave Ipre, and to visit our several Gatrisons in Artois, and to put them into a posture of defence.

On Sunday lait an Express was sent into Flanders with Orders for the march of the Duke de Haures and de Morfy's Regiments to Ayre, to reinforce that Garrison which was of late become weak, and the Companies thin.

Orders were a fo dispatche to the Spanish Regiments under the Command of Don Fernandez Valladares, and Don Pedro d' Aldado to march, the first to Louvain, and the second by Ma'ines towards Mons, which was accordingly put in execution, but the later marching out of Malines, a soldier of the said Regiment firing his Musket, unhappily killed three of the Townsmen, which occasioned Io great a Tumult and disorder in the I own, that the whole Regiment might have ran much hazard, had not the Officers and Magistrates used extraordinay prudence to prevent it.

Another Spanish Regiment is to be sent away to reinforce the Garrison at Valencienne.

On Wednefday last arrived here an Express from Spain with Letters to the Constable of Cassille from the Queen Resent, by which the is pleased in acknowledgement of his good fervices, to confer on him the place in the Council for the Government, larely vacant by the death of the Marquis d'Aytona, which tis believed will occasion his ludden departure for Spain, but not till fome other person be sent to facceed him in this Government. Don Juan of Austria is pressed to undertake this charge, but if no arguments can prevail with him to accept thereof, tis believed may be conferred on Charles, Prince of Lorrain.

Several conferences have been held between the States Deputies and Marshal Wurtz, with other principal Officers of the Army about the recruits: Holland intends to faile forthwith 6 or 7000 men for the firengthning the Garrilons upop the Rhine, and in Flanders.

The 2d inftant, fome Commiffioners appointed by the States, had a conference with Monfieur Blafpil, the Elector of Brandenbourgs Envoye, who intends fuddenly for Cleves, but to return again prefently after Eafter.

The Commissioners appointed for the examination of

the differences between the Citlet of Amflerdam and Leyden, have been lately at Amflerdam, and may in few days be able to give the States an account of that affair.

Vice-Admiral Van Ghent was this day refolved to leave Amflerdam, having in his company, a fon of the Count de Stirum, to embark at the Texel aboard the man of war on which he intends to fail, with 11 others to the Streights, to fecure our Trade against the Pirats of Algiers.

Paris, April 9. Yesterday His Majely arrived here from St Germains, Visited several places, and afterwards was pleased to be present at the Christining of Madams younger Daughter the Dutchess of Valois at the Carmelises Church in Rue de Boulog.

The King hath altered his Refolution and will not begin his journey towards Flanders, till the fecond of May.

The last Courier from Rome tells us, that the Divisions and Factions in the Conclave continue as high as ever, but that our Ambassiadour the Duke de Chaulnes, has by his frequent addresses to the Queen of Smedin prevayled with het to use her interest with the Squadronists which is very considerable, to make cho ce of such a person as may not have any unkindness for the interest of France.
