Y Order of the Right Honourable the Lords and o-thers, her Majesty's Commissioners for receiving and disposing of the Mony to be collected for the Subfiftance and Settlement of the poor Palatines: Notice is hereby given, That they having determined to fend five hundred Families of the faid Palatines with their Goods to Ireland by way of Chester, they will allow seven Shillings for the Carriage of every hundred weight to Cheffer; and will be ready every day at their Committee to contract with any Persons that are willing to be im-

ployed in carrying the fame.

Notice is hereby likewise given, that all Persons concerned in collecting the Mony on the Brief for the Relief of the said Palatines, are hereby required to collect the fame by a Book or Books, marked and figned by the Mimiler and Church-wardens of the respective Parishes, and to exter therein the Names of the Contributors, and the Sum by them severally given in Words at length, at the time the same is given, and to cast up on each Page of every Leaf the Total Sum, and to subscribe the same on each Page, with the Hand of the Minister, Church-wardens, or such other principal Inhabitant as attends the said Collection.

Notice is hereby also given. That for the encouraging of Persons and Parishes to receive and imploy the Pala-tiaes during the Time of Harvest, or otherwise, Care shall be taken to provide a Fund for the Maintenance of fuch of them as shall, by Sickness, or other Accidents, be rendred incapable of getting their Living by their Labours and for the securing such Parishes as shall receive any of them, that they shall not become a Burthen or Charge to such Parishes, by their being imployed or settled there.

Lubon, July 24. N. S. Sir John Jennings is arrived here from the Streights, who left all things at Barcelona in a very prosperous condition. The Army is in so good order, that his Catholick Majesty will be able to act or-fensively against the Enemy. Several Ships loaden with Corn, and bound from Barbary to France, have been letely intercepted. Letters from Villa Vicosa of the twelfth Inflant fay, that our Army was marched into Quarters of Retreftment, aud that feveral Brit fh Regiments lay in

the Neighbourhood of that Place.

Berne, July 13. N. S. The fix Deputies of the Coun-Berne, July 28. N. S. The fix Deputies of the County of Tockenbourg, of whom three are Proveflants, and vances before the Diet of Baden. Among other things, they complain that the Abbot of St. Gall, notwithfanding the contrary Orders of the preceding Diets, had laid up a great quantity of Provisions and Ammunition in his Galle of Yberg. In the mean time the Popish Cantons endeavour to excuse the Abbot, and extenuare his Negket of that Order. Letters from Geneva fay, that the numbers of the Malecontents in the Vivarez encrease evey day; and that they had a referved Body posted at Gillor, to which Place they conveyed their sick and wounded. The rest of their Troops were distributed in small Bodies. for the conveniencey of being supplied with Provisions.

They have not yet loft any of their chief Leaders. Thefe Letters add, that the King's Forces, which were fent to supprets these Malecoments, were encamped at Ayroux, confilling of five thousand Men; and that several large Detachments from them had been defeated, particularly a confiderable Bedy in an Action of the ninth Infrant-

Bruffels, August 5. N. S. Our last Advices from Madrid fay, that all the Troops under the Command of the Marquis de Bay were gone into Quarters of Refreshment, except some Detachments which were appointed to intercept fuch Convoys as might be fent with Supplies to Oliveres, and fix Battalions of Guards which were ordered to march to Arragon. The Count d' Estaing has set out from the Court of Madrid towards France; and it is said the Marshal de Bezons intends also to begin his Journey thither within few days. These Letters mention a Di-scovery of a secret Intelligence which had been carried on in order to deliver Lerida into the Hands of his Carholick Majesty, and report that several Persons of the first Rank are supposed to have favoured that Design.

Hague, August 6. N. S. The Marquis de Surville has offered to furrender the Cittadel of Tournay upon certain Conditions; and the Terms on which he infifts were communicated to the States by an Express which arrived this Morning. The Marquis obliges himself, by this Capitulation, to deliver the Place into the hands of the Allies on the fifth of September next, in case it shall not be relieved within that time; and further engages to deliver one of the Gates, and to admit three hundred Men to take Possession of it, as soon as his Master's Approbation of this Treary for the Place shall be returned; which Ratification he expected to receive on the eighth Inffant-In the mean time all Acts of Hostility shall cease between the Besiegers and Besieged. The States have thought sie to approve this Capitulation, and have fent backtheir Ratifications of it by Expreis. Advices from Savoy of the twenty fixth of the last Month fay, that Count Theun had forced the Post of Monstiers, and marched as for as Aiguebelle; and that the Enemy appeared to be in great Apprehensions from the different Movements which were made by the Forces of his Royal Highness. An Account of a compleat Victory obtained over the Swedes by the Mulcovires is reported here, with many Circumflances of the Action : But there are Letters from Koningfberg of the twenty fixth of the last Month, which are as particular in a Relation in favour of the Swedes. Thefe Advices fay, that in this Engament the King of Sweden having led on his Troops a lecond time to the Charge, affaulted and took the Village of Pultawa; and add, that great part of his Russian Majesty's Infantry was cut off, great part of his Kunnan Majenty's infantry was cut on, in attempting to recover that Post. Letters from Copenhagen say, that the King of Denmark arrived there on the 26th of the last Month. Those Advices inform us, that his Majesty having passed through Renbourg in his Return from Italy, had created the Duke Administrator of Holstein Gottorp, Knight of the Order of the Elephants and that at the same time the King was pleased so give the Order of Dannebroek to Lieutenant-General Ranzau. to Monfieur Stucken his Majefty's Envoy-Extraordinary in Hol'and, the Counsellor Rosencias, to Monsieur Lerche, to Monfieur Plugg, Steward of the Houshold to King Augustus, to Major General Crag, and to Major-General Schonteld.
