The London—Holyhead Trunk Road (London Road, Holyhead, Diversion Side Roads) Order 1972

The Secretary of State hereby gives notice that in relation to the above-mentioned Trunk Road at Holyhead in the County of Anglesey, he has made an Order under section 9 of the above-named Act which will authorise the Secretary of State:

- (a) to improve, raise, lower or otherwise alter highways,
 - (b) to stop up highways
