TYLDESLEY URBAN DISTRICT COUNCIL

CLEAN AIR ACTS, 1956 AND 1968

The Tyldesley Urban District Council (No. 4) Smoke Control Order 1972

Notice is hereby given that the Urban District Council of Tyldesley in exercise of the powers conferred on them by section 11 of the Clean Air Act, 1956, on the 23rd day of May 1972, made an Order entitled the Tyldesley Urban District Council (No. 4) Smoke Control Order, 1972, declaring the area described in the Schedule hereto to be a smoke control area, which Order is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation.

Subject to the limitations and exemptions provided by the Order and by virtue of section 11 (4) of the Clean Air Act, 1956, if, on any day after the Order has come into operation, smoke is emitted from a chimney of any building within the smoke control area, the occupier of that building shall be guilty of an offence, and liable to a fine not exceeding £20 unless he proves that the emission of smoke was not caused by the use of any fuel, other than an authorised fuel. The authorised fuels include anthracite, coke and other carbonised fuels, gas and electricity.

If confirmed the Order will not come into operation before the 1st day of April 1973, or before a

date determined by the Secretary of State for the Environment.

Copies of the Order and of the Map referred to therein may be inspected free of charge at the Town Hall, Tyldesley, at all reasonable times during the period of six weeks from the 16th June 1972.

Within the said period, any person who will be affected by the Order may by notice in writing to the Secretary of State for the Environment, Department of the Environment, 2 Marsham Street, London, SW1P 3EB, object to the confirmation of the Order.

SCHEDULE

An area in the whole containing 82 acres or thereabouts, bounded on its several sides by the following:

On the westerly side by:

The Urban District boundary with the Atherton Urban District;

On the northerly side by:

The Urban District boundary with the Atherton Urban District to Castle Street, along the westerly side of Castle Street to its junction with Shuttle Street, along the southerly side of Shuttle Street to its junction with Milk Street;

On the easterly side by:

The westerly side of Milk Street, across Elliott Street to its junction with Well Street, along the westerly side of Well Street to the southerly side of the Manchester to Wigan railway line;

On the southerly side by:

The Manchester to Wigan railway line westward to the boundary with the Atherton Urban District.

COAST PROTECTION ACT, 1949

LOOE URBAN DISTRICT COUNCIL

ALTRINCHAM BOROUGH COUNCIL

The Altrincham Corporation (Ashley Road) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1972
