The City and County Borough of Cardiff (Crwys Road) (Limited Waiting) Order 1972

Notice is hereby given that the Council of the City and County Borough of Cardiff propose to make an Order under section 1 (1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act, 1968.

When this Order comes into effect you will not be allowed to leave your vehicle between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6.30 p.m., Mondays to Saturdays, in Crwys Road:

(a) on the north-east side thereof, between a point 500 feet north-west of its junction with Mac-kintosh Place and a point 740 feet north-west of that junction on those days of the month which bear even numbers; or

(b) on the south-west side thereof, between a point 540 feet north-west of its junction with Richmond Road and a point 780 feet north-west of that junction on those days of the month which bear odd numbers.

On the side that waiting will be permitted it will be restricted to 1 hour in any period of 2 hours.

Exceptions will permit waiting for the purposes of:

- (a) picking up and setting down passengers;
- (b) loading or unloading goods;
- (c) funerals;

and, where necessary, in connection with:

- (d) the maintenance of the road and sewers;
- (e) the supply of gas, electricity and water.

The limited waiting will not apply to disabled persons' vehicles displaying a valid disabled person's badge issued by a local authority in pursuance of a scheme under section 21 of the Chronically Sick and Disabled Persons Act 1970.
