ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1967

The Trunk Road (Various Roads, Kettering) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) Order 1972

The Secretary of State for the Environment has made an Order under section 1 and 84D of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, the effect of which is to revoke and re-enact with amendments and additions the restrictions relating to the waiting of vehicles on the A6 Trunk Road in the Borough of Kettering, Northants. The Order prohibits waiting:

(a) at any time on any of the sides of road specified in Schedule 1 hereto;

specified in Schedule 1 hereto;

(b) between 8 a.m. and 8 p.m. on any of the sides of road specified in Schedule 2 hereto;

(c) between 8 a.m. and 9 a.m. or 4.30 p.m. and 6 p.m. (except Sundays) on any of the sides of road specified in Schedule 3 hereto; or

(d) between 9 a.m. and 4.30 p.m. or 6 p.m. and 8 p.m. (except Sundays) on any of the sides of road specified in Schedule 3 hereto:

(i) for a longer period than 30 minutes; or

(i) for a longer period than 30 minutes; or
(ii) if a period of less than 30 minutes has
elapsed since the termination during the said
hours of the last period of waiting (if any) of
the vehicle on that side of road.

Exceptions have been provided in the Order to enable a vehicle to wait for so long as may be necessary for a person to board or alight from the vehicle, to enable goods to be loaded on to or unloaded from the vehicle, or to enable the vehicle to be used in connection with any building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance of the road or the services

therein.

Any person who desires to question the validity of, or of any provision contained in, the Order, on the ground that it is not within the powers with respect to the Order conferred by the above Act, or on the ground that any requirement of, or of any instrument made under, any provision of that Act has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may within 6 weeks of the 26th June 1972 apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained therein.

Waiting Prohibited at All Times

1. High Street, west side, from 72 yards north of its junction with Walker's Lane to its junction with Lower Street and Gold Street.

2. Lower Street, both sides, from its junction with High Street to 96 yards north of its junction with

Trafalgar Road.
3. Gold Street, north side, from its junction with High Street to 21 yards west of its junction with Meeting Lane.

4. Central traffic island at the junction of High Street, Lower Street and Gold Street, all sides.

SCHEDULE 2

Waiting Prohibited between 8 a.m. and 8 p.m.

1. Sheep Street, east side, from 26 yards north of its junction with Market Place.

2. Market Place, east side, from its junction with Sheep Street to its junction with High Street.

3. High Street, east side, from its junction with Market Place to its junction with Gold Street.

4. Gold Street

(a) south side, from its junction with High Street to its junction with Newland Street;
(b) north side, from 96 yards west of its junction with Newland Street to that junction.

5. Silver Street, both sides, from its junction with Montague Street to 77 yards south of that junction.
6. Dalkeith Place, both sides, from 54 yards north of its junction with Carrington Street to that junction.
7. Horse Market, both sides, from its junction with

Carrington Street to its junction with London Road.

8. London Road, both sides, from its junction with Horse Market to 85 yards north of its junction with St. Peter's Avenue.

Waiting Prohibited between 8 a.m. and 9 a.m. and 4.30 p.m. and 6 p.m. except Sundays: Waiting for more than 30 minutes Prohibited and No Return
