NOTICE OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT, 1971—
 SECTION 210

The Kent County Council (F.P. 7 (part) Swanscombe Urban District) Public Path Diversion Order, 1972.

Notice is hereby given that the above-mentioned Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") made on 13th June 1972, is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation or to be confirmed by the Kent County Council as an unopposed Order.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modification, will be to divert that length of F.P.7 Swanscombe Urban District (leading from Knockhall Road at Knockhall House to Alkerden Lane) from a point 260 feet south-east of Knockhall Road for 420 feet eastwards to a point 340 feet north-west of the tunnel under the mineral railway to a new length of footpath leading from the point 260 feet south-east of Knockhall Road for 400 feet east-north-eastwards and 80 feet southwards to rejoin F.P.7 at the point 340 feet north-west of the tunnel under the mineral railway.

A copy of the Order and the map contained in it has been deposited at County Hall, Room 138, Maidstone, and at the offices of the Clerk to the Swanscombe Urban District Council, Manor House, Swanscombe, and may be inspected free of charge during normal office hours.

Any representation or objection with respect to the Order may be sent in writing to the Clerk of the County Council, County Hall, Maidstone, quoting the reference D4/RD 21/301(P) not later than 29th July 1972, and should state the grounds on which it is made.

If no representations or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn, the Kent County Council may, instead of submitting the Order to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation, themselves confirm the Order as an unopposed Order. If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State for confirmation any representations and objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be sent to the Secretary of State with the Order.

Town and Country Planning General Development Order, 1963

Direction Restricting Permitted Development on land at Etchden Wood, Bethersden
