Town and Country Planning General Development Order, 1963

Direction Restricting Permitted Development on land at Bredhurst Hurst, Bredhurst

Notice is hereby given that the County Council of the Administrative County of Kent in pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by Article 4 of the Town and Country Planning General Development Order, 1963, has made a Direction so that the permission granted by Article 3 of the said Order shall not apply to the land at Bredhurst Hurst in the Parish of Bredhurst in the Rural District of Hollingbourn insofar as development comprised within Classes II(1), IV(2), VII and XXII(part) of Part I of the First Schedule to the Town and Country Planning General Development Order, 1963, is concerned. The effect of the Direction is that planning permission must be obtained before any Development in the before-mentioned Classes is carried out on the said land.

Certified copies of the Direction may be inspected at my office and at the office of the Hollingbourn Rural District Council at 73 College Road, Maidstone, at all reasonable hours.

The Direction comes into force upon the date of publication of this notice.

NOTICE OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT, 1971
SECTION 210

The Mablethorpe and Sutton Urban District Council (Mablethorpe) Public Path Diversion Order No. 1, 1972.

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") made on the 10th April 1972 is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation or to be confirmed by the Mablethorpe and Sutton Urban District Council as an unopposed Order.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modification, will be to divert the public right of way through O.S. Field No. 8551 between St. Mary's Church Burial Ground and a point approximately 113 yards to the east, to a line commencing at the same point at the Burial Ground and running in a north-easterly direction for approximately 36 yards where it joins proposed estate road, thence along the proposed estate road for a distance of approximately 60 yards and then turning in a south-easterly direction for a distance of approximately 40 yards, there joining up with the undiverted section of the public right of way.

A copy of the Order and the map contained in it has been deposited at the Council Offices, Victoria Road, Mablethorpe, Lincs., and may be inspected free of charge between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. on Monday to Friday.

Any representations or objection with respect to the Order may be sent in writing to the Clerk of the Mablethorpe and Sutton Urban District Council, Council Offices, Victoria Road, Mablethorpe, Lincs., not later than 31st July 1972, and should state the grounds on which it is made.

If no representations or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn, the Mablethorpe and Sutton Urban District Council may, instead of submitting the Order to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation, themselves confirm the Order as an unopposed Order. If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State for confirmation any representations and objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be sent to the Secretary of State with the Order.

This Order becomes operative as from the 18th July but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof, or of any provision contained therein, on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Town and Country Planning Act, 1971, or on the ground that any requirement of that Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the confirmation of the Order, he may under section 244 of the Town and Country Planning Act, 1971, within 6 weeks from the 30th June 1972, make application for this purpose to the High Court.

Somerset (Footpath No. 21/15 at Lower Claverham, Yatton) Public Path Order, 1972

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") made on the 23rd June 1972 is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation or to be confirmed by the Somerset County Council as an unopposed Order.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modification, will be to divert that part of footpath 21/15 at Lower Claverham Court that runs from its junction with the unclassified road from Claverham Court to Brockley Elm for a distance of approximately 50 yards in a southerly direction, to run from a point approximately 15 yards east of the original path at its junction with the unclassified road from Claverham Court to Brockley Elm southwards for a distance of approximately 40 yards then westwards for a distance of approximately 15 yards to join the route of footpath 21/15.

A copy of the Order and map contained in it has been deposited and may be inspected free of charge at the Office of the Clerk of the Long Ashton Rural District Council, Flax Bourton, Bristol, or at the Post Office, Claverham, during normal office hours.

Any representation or objection with respect to the Order may be sent in writing to the undersigned not later than 28th July, 1972, and should state the grounds on which it is made.

If no representations or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn, the Somerset County Council may, instead of submitting the Order to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation themselves confirm the Order as an unopposed Order. If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State for confirmation any representations and objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be sent to the Secretary of State with the Order.
