*City of York Development Plan**Bootham-Gillygate Comprehensive Development Area*

Notice is hereby given that on the 3rd March 1972 the Secretary of State for the Environment amended the above Development Plan. The amendment is in accordance with the Secretary of State's proposed modifications as published on the 11th and 18th December 1970. A hearing of an objection to the proposed modifications was held on the 21st September 1971, but the Secretary of State does not propose to amend the modifications in order to meet the objection.

A certified copy of the amended Development Plan together with a copy of:

- (i) the Inspectors' Reports of the Public Local Inquiry and of the hearing;
- (ii) a statement of rights of appeal to the High Court; and
- (iii) the Secretary of State's reasons for departing from certain of the Inspectors' recommendations

have been deposited at my office in the Guildhall, York and at the office of the City Planning Officer, 5 St. Leonard's Place, York.

The copies of the Development Plan and the reports and other documents mentioned in the previous paragraph so deposited, will be open for inspection free of charge by all persons interested between 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. Monday to Friday inclusive.

The amendment became operative as from the 4th July 1972 but if any person aggrieved by it desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971 or of the Town and Country Planning Act 1962 or on the ground that any requirement of the Acts or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the making of the amendment, he may, within 6 weeks from the 4th July 1972, make application to the High Court.

Shillington Public Path Diversion Order 1972*

Notice is hereby given that on the 29th June 1972 the Amphill Rural District Council confirmed the above Order without modification.

The effect of the Order, as confirmed, is to divert the public right of way running from point B on the map annexed to the Order which is a point at the eastern end of footpath 36 and on the boundary between O.S. 293 and O.S. 316, running in a north-easterly direction for a distance of about 260 ft. to point A adjacent to the Red Sign Post, to a line from the aforesaid point B running along the hedge between O.S. 293 and O.S. 316 to point C which is at the junction of the field hedge and verge hedge in Upton End Road and approximately 55 ft. south-east from the aforesaid point A.

A copy of the Order, as confirmed, and the map contained in it has been deposited and may be inspected, free of charge, at the Council Offices, 12 Dunstable Street, Ampthill, Bedford, between 9 a.m. and 1 p.m. and 2 p.m. and 5 p.m. Mondays to Fridays.

The Order becomes operative as from the 11th July 1972 but if a person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof, or of any provision contained therein, on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act 1959, as amended, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act, as amended, or of any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the Order he may under paragraph 2 of Schedule 2 of the Act as applied by paragraph 5 of Schedule 7 to the Act, within 6 weeks from the 11th July 1972 make application for the purpose to the High Court.
