UNIVERSITIES OF OXFORD AND CAMBRIDGE ACT, 1923

Two Statutes made by the Governing Body of Wadham College in the University of Oxford on the 7th July 1972, have been submitted for the approval of Her Majesty in Council, and notice of their having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923.

PRESENT,

The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council
Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred on Her by section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865 (1865 c. 73) and of all other powers enabling Her in that behalf, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered as follows:

Citation

1. This Order may be cited as the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions (Forfeiture) Order 1972.

Interpretation

2. (a) The Interpretation Act 1889 (1889 c. 63) shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

(b) in this Order "the Act" means the Naval Discipline Act 1957 (1957 c. 53) as amended.

Forfeiture of Pay

3. Subject to the provisions of section 128A of the Act as inserted by section 61 of the Armed Forces Act 1971 (1971 c. 33), any pay, half pay, bounty, salvage and allowances earned by, or annuities, pensions and gratuities granted to, a person subject to the Act shall be subject to forfeiture in accordance with Article 4 of this Order.

4.—(i) In all cases of dismissal with disgrace from Her Majesty's service, all pay, bounty, salvage and allowances and all annuities, pensions and gratuities shall be forfeited by the offender.

(ii) In cases of dismissal from Her Majesty's service (whether awarded by sentence or deemed to have been included in a sentence of imprisonment), any one or more of the following, that is to say, pay, bounty, salvage and allowances, and annuities, pensions and gratuities, may be forfeited by the offender.

(iii) In cases of detention, pay may be forfeited by the offender for the period of the detention.

5. This Order shall come into operation on 1st July 1972.
