been dispersed over Savoy. They have sent their Equipage to Seissel on the other side of the Rhone, and it is expected that they will also pass that River on the Approach of the Enemy. The Head Quarters of Count Thaun were at St. Peter d' Albigny on the 30th of the last Month, which is but two Leagues from Montmellian. Letters from Geneva say, that there was an Action on the 19th last past, between the King's Forces and the Malecontents in the Vivareze; but the Success of that Engagement is not certainly known, though it is reported the Malecontents were defeated.

From the Imperial Camp near Langencandel. August 13-N. S. His Electoral Highmols of Hanover arrived at the Army on the 8th Instant, and the same Day passed the Rhine over the Bridge of Philipsbourg, and encamped in this Place. The Prince Alexander of Wirtemberg, and Major-General Hoffman, have already joined our Army with two Regiments drawn our of the Garrison of Lau-We have also received a great quantity of Artillery from Phil psi ourg; and the neighbouring Baillages have brought in feveral Horfes and Waggons, for the Transportation of our Cannon, Baggage and Provisions. The Marshal d'Harcourt is retired with all his Forces behind the Lines of Lauterbourg; but our Army being much Superior to the Enemy, it is supposed he will be obliged to quit the Lines, if his Highness thinks fit to Attack him. The Imperial fits having laid a Bridge of Communication of the Delivery of the Property of the Propert nication over the Rhine at Schreck, are building a Fort for its Ocience. Letters from Starbourg fay, that a Correspondence for delivering that City to the Imperialists is discovered, and that a hundred Burghers have been apprehended on Suspicion of being concerned in the Defign. They add, that great quantities of Provision and Ammunition were found to have been concealed by priva e Hands; and that those Stores have been seized for

the use of the Garrison. Hagne, Aug. 20. N. S. The States of Holland are appointed to Assemble max Week. The Count de Brousy fucceeds Don Quiros in the fame Character in which he lately ferved his Catholick Majesty. On the 14th Instant Monfieur Plessin left this Place on his way to Copenhagen. Our late Advices from France fay, that they had discovered a Forgery of fo great quantity of their Mony Bills, that it had almost destroyed their Credit. These Letters add, that the People are very backward in bringing their Silver into the Mint; and their Species of Gold is fo mach Counterfeited, that it is faid the Currency of it will be prohibited in this Country. The late Action in Savoy is confirmed from all Parts; and Count Thaun, according to the Advices of the 9th Instant, had disposed of his Troops in such a manner, that he commanded the Country from Conflans to St. Pierre d'Albigny, where he expected the Horse and Artillery to join him from Piedmont, bo h being already passed Mount Cenis. The Duke of Description has being already passed Mount Cenis. Remark lay behind a Line which he had thrown up at Montmellian, with his Right covered by the Izere, and his Left by the Mountains. Those Advices add, that his Army was in great want both of Mony and Provisions; and that they could not expect to be supplied from Languedoc. Diuphice or Provence. the Corn in all those Countries having been generally destroyed by all theill Accidents of both the Summer and Winter Scalon. They write from the Frontiers of Flanders, that the French Garrisons, as well as their Armies, are under a necessity of oillributing half a Pound of Flesh, instead of a full Pound, and two Liards, instead of two Pence a Day to each Soldier, besides his Bread. The Subaltern Officers are allowed but half their usual Fay; the Severity of this Order occisioned the late Insurrection at Ipres, in which many Houses were pliaged. the Officers being unable to prevent these Disorders, and several being wounded in attempting to appeale the Tu-We have fresh Advices of the Defeat of the Swecish Army near Poltowa, which add, that a Rody con-filing or seven thousand Swedes and eight thousand Cosfacks, which had retreated from that Barrel towards the Bornthenes, having been closely pursued by the Musco-vi et, and maging both Provisions and Ammunition, fur-rendred themicives Prisoners of War. The faid, the King or Sweden himself escaped by swimming over the Borifthenes, being tollowed by only eight bundred of his Horfe, and that General Mazappa hath also faved himself by Flight.

Faimouth, August 13. Yesterday sailed the Sophia Packer-bear, Capt. Smith Commander, for Plimouth; the Resolution Facket-beat from the West Indies, but last from Mount's Bay, and a Durch Runner from Guiney, arrived here Yesterday.

Darmouth, August 14. Rear-Admiral Baker, with the Outward-bound Fleet, are still detained in Torbay by contrary Winds. They have taken several small French

Privateers, which lay hovering on our Coast.

Tarmouth, August 15. On the 13th Instant divers light Colliers failed for Newcastle. Yesterday Her Majesty's Ships the Lime and Flamborough, with feveral Light Colliers under their Convoy, arrived here from the Southword, bound for Newcastle. Her Majesty's Ship the Gosport passed through our Road Yesterday, from Humber to the Southward. This Day divers laden Colliers are come in from Newcastle.
