PRESENT

THE QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council

Whereas by section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act 1865 (28 and 29 Vict. c. 73.) it is enacted that all pay, wages, pensions, bounty money, grants or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Her Majesty's naval or marine force to a person being or having been an officer, seaman or marine, or to the widow or any relative of a deceased officer, seaman or marine, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions, as are from time to time directed by Order in Ceuncil:

And whereas Her Majesty deems it expedient to amend the Order in Council dated 25th September 1964, as amended (The relevant amending Orders are the Orders of 22nd December 1964, 24th February 1966, 9th June 1966, 23rd August 1967, 26th July 1968, 31st July 1969 and 28th July 1971) concerning pensions and other grants in respect of disablement or death due to service in the naval forces during the 1914 World War and after 2nd September 1939 (hereinafter referred to as the "1964 Order"):

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred upon Her as aforesaid and of all other powers whatsoever Her thereunto enabling, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered that, notwithstanding anything in the 1964 Order, the following provisions of this Order shall take effect accordingly and, except in the cases stated in the Order in Council of 19th December 1881, and except as otherwise provided by statute, shall be established and obeyed as the sole authority in the matters herein treated of.

1. For Schedules 2, 3 (other than Part II of Table 3 thereof), 4, 6 and 7 to the 1964 Order (rates of pensions and other grants payable in respect of disablement or death due to service in the naval forces during the 1914 World War and after 2nd September 1939) there shall be substituted the Schedules set out in Part I of the Appendix hereto and numbered 2, 3, 4, 6 and 7 respectively.

Amendment of Articles of the 1964 Order

2. In Articles 5 (entitlement where a claim is made in respect of a disablement, or death occurs, more than 7 years after the termination of service), 17 (unemployability allowances), 21 (treatment allowances), 31(rent allowance to widows, and unmarried dependants who lived as wives, who have children) and 71 (commencement and application of the Order, amendment and revocation of previous Orders, and transitional provisions) of the 1964 Order there shall be made the amendments set out in Part II of the Appendix hereto.

Substitution of Article 57 of the 1964 Order 3. For Article 57 of the 1964 Order (pensioners admitted to institutions) there shall be substituted the Article set out in Part III of the Appendix hereto.

Commencement

4.—(1) Subject to the following provisions of this Article, this Order shall come into operation on 2nd October 1972 so, however, that in relation to any award payable weekly the foregoing reference to 2nd October 1972, where this is not the normal weekly pay day for that award, shall be construed as a reference to the first normal weekly pay day for that award, shall be construed as a reference to the first normal weekly pay day for that award following 2nd October 1972.

(2) Article 1 shall come into operation in relation to an officer on 1st October 1972.

(3) In so far as Article 1 substitutes the higher maximum rate of allowance for part-time treatment specified in paragraph 10 of Schedule 6 in Part I of the Appendix hereto, it shall be deemed to have come into operation on 3rd November 1971.

Amendment of Articles of the 1964 Order

1. In Article 5 (entitlement where a claim is made in respect of a disablement, or death occurs, more than 7 years after the termination of service) in paragraph (1) the words "and he was at the time of his death, or at any

time previously thereto had been, in receipt of a pension awarded by the Minister under this Order or any previous Order " shall be omitted, and paragraph (6) is hereby revoked.

2. In Article 17 (unemployability allowances) in paragraph (2) for the words "£104 a year" there shall be substituted the words "£234 a year".

- 3. In Article 21 (treatment allowances) for paragraph (4A) there shall be substituted the following paragraph:— "(4A) The rate of an additional allowance awarded under paragraph (4) of this Article in respect of a child or children of a member may be further increased to the appropriate rate specified in Schedule 6 paragraph 9(e) if the member—
 - (a) is in receipt of an increase of his personal allowance under paragraph (3)(c) of this Article or, but for his age on the relevant date, would be in receipt of such an increase; or
 - (b) is in receipt of an allowance under Article 17(1)(i); or
 - (c) having reached the age of 65 years or, in the case of a woman member, 60 years is not eligible for retirement pension under the National Insurance Acts 1965 to 1972, or any benefit similar thereto as is referred to in paragraph (6) of this Article, solely by reason of his failure to satisfy any contribution conditions.".

4. In Article 31 (rent allowance to widows, and unmarried dependants who lived as wives, who have children) in paragraph (1) for the words "having regard to the amount by which her weekly rent and rates exceed 6s." there shall be substituted the words "having regard to her weekly rent and rates".

5. In Article 71 (commencement and application of this Order, amendment and revocation of previous Orders, and transitional provisions) at the end of paragraph (7) there shall be added the words "and as if any requirement thereof that the member had been at the time of his death in receipt of retired pay, pension or allowance in respect of disablement, was satisfied in every case.".

PART III

Substitution of Article 57 of the 1964 Order

For Article 57 (pensioners admitted to institutions) there shall be substituted the following Article:-

"57. Maintenance in hospital or an institution.—(1) Where any person to or in respect of whom a pension or gratuity may be or has been awarded is receiving or has received free in-patient treatment, or is being or has been maintained in an institution (otherwise than for the purpose of undergoing medical or other treatment) which is supported wholly or partly out of public funds, or in which he is being or has been maintained pursuant to arrangements made by the Secretary of State, the Secretary of State may deduct such amount as he may think fit having regard to all the circumstances of the case from the pension or gratuity payable in respect of the period during which such treatment is received or during which the person is being so maintained, as the case may be, and may apply the amount so deducted, or any part thereof, in such proportions and subject to such conditions as he may determine having regard to all the circumstances of the case, in a payment or payments to the person upon his discharge following a period of free in-patient treatment, or in or towards paying or repaying the cost of maintaining the person incurred by any appropriate authority.

(2) For the purposes of this Article, a person shall be regarded as receiving or having received free in-patient treatment for any period for which he is or has been maintained free of charge while undergoing medical or other treatment as an in-patient—

- (a) in a hospital or similar institution maintained or administered under the National Health Service Acts 1946 to 1968, the National Health Service (Scotland) Acts 1947 to 1968 or the Health Services Act (Northern Ireland) 1971, or by or on behalf of the Secretary of State, or by or on behalf of the Defence Council; or
- (b) pursuant to arrangements made by the Secretary of State or by a Hospital Board or a Regional Hospital Board constituted under the National Health Service Acts 1946 to 1968, the National Health Service (Scotland) Acts 1947 to 1968 or the Health Services Act (Northern Ireland) 1971 in a hospital or similar institution not so maintained or administered;

and, for this purpose, a person shall only be regarded as not being maintained free of charge in a hospital or similar institution for any period if he is paying or has paid, in respect of maintenance, charges which are designed to cover the whole cost of the accommodation or services (other than services by way of treatment) provided for him in the hospital or similar institution for that period.".

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order.)

This Order further amends the Order of 25th September 1964.

Article 1 substitutes new Tables for those contained in Schedules 2, 3, 4, 6 and 7 to the 1964 Order and has the effect of increasing-

Disablement pensions and allowances

- (a) the rates of pensions in respect of 100 per cent. disablement by £62.00 a year in the case of officers and by £1.20 a week in the case of ratings and the rates of pensions for lower degrees of disablement and awards for cases of minor injuries and other cases of less than 20 per cent. disablement proportionately;
- (b) the maximum rates of disablement addition on a pension basis payable to certain officers in receipt of service retired pay by £62.00 a year;
- (c) the normal maximum rate of an allowance payable for constant attendance from £208.00 a year to £234.00 a year in the case of officers and from £4.00 a week to £4.50 a week in the case of ratings, and the maximum rate for exceptional cases of very severe disablement from £416.00 a year to £468.00 a year in the case of officers and from £8.00 a week to £9.00 a week in the case of ratings;
- (d) the exceptionally severe disablement allowance from £208.00 a year to £234.00 a year in the case of officers and from £4.00 a week to £4.50 a week in the case of ratings;
- (e) the allowance for unemployable pensioners from £340.60 a year to £382.20 a year in the case of officers and from £6.55 a week to £7.35 a week in the case of ratings;
- (f) the total of additional allowance payable in respect of the wife or adult dependant of an unemployable pensioner and of a pensioner receiving treatment as defined in Article 21(8) from £192.40 a year to £215.80 a year in the case of officers and from £3.70 a week to £4.15 a week in the case of ratings;
- (g) the allowances payable in respect of children of unemployable pensioners in respect of the first or only child from £153.40 a year to £171.60 a year in the case of officers and from £2.95 a week to £3.30 a week in the case of ratings, in respect of the second child from £106.60 a year to £124.80 a year in the case of officers and from £2.05 a week to £2.40 a week in the case of ratings and in respect of any other child from £101.40 a year to £119.60 a year in the case of officers and from £1.95 a week to £2.30 a week in the case of ratings;

- (h) the maximum allowance for lowered standard of occupation from £208.00 a year to £232.96 a year in the case of officers and from £4.00 a week to £4.48 a week in the case of ratings;
- (i) the allowances payable to pensioners who have attained the age of 65 and whose pensioned disablement is assessed at 40 per cent. or over from between £26.00 a year and £72.80 a year to between £28.60 a year and £83.20 a year in the case of officers and from between £0.50 a week and £1.40 a week to between £0.55 a week and £1.60 a week in the case of ratings;
- (j) the allowances payable in respect of children of pensioners receiving treatment as defined in Article 21(8) in respect of the first or only child from £96.20 a year to £109.20 a year in the case of officers and from £1.85 a week to £2.10 a week in the case of ratings, in respect of the second child from £49.40 a year to £62.40 a year in the case of officers and from £0.95 a week to £1.20 a week in the case of officers and from £0.95 a week to £1.20 a week in the case of ratings, and in respect of any other child from £44.20 a year to £57.20 a year in the case of officers and from £0.85 a week to £1.10 a week in the case of ratings, and to further increase those allowances where the said pensioners are not ertitled to invalidity pension and allowance under national insurance provisions solely because of failure to satisfy the contribution conditions to £171.60 a year; £3.30 a week; £1124.80 a year; £2.40 a week; £119.60 a year and £2.30 a week respectively;
- (k) the maximum of the additional personal treatment allowance payable to a pensioner who is not entitled to full sickness benefit or invalidity pension and allowance under national insurance provisions from £6.00 a week to £6.75 a week;

Widow's benefits

- (1) the rates of pensions for certain widows by £52.00 a year in the case of officers and by £1.00 a week in the case of ratings;
- (m) the maximum pensions payable to unmarried dependants who lived as wives of deceased members of the naval forces from £406.50 a year to £458.50 a year in the case of officers and from £7.30 a week to £8.30 a week in the case of ratings;
- (n) the maximum rent allowance payable to certain widows from $\pounds 3.00$ a week to $\pounds 3.40$ a week;
- (a) the allowances payable to widows in respect of children for the first or only child from £171.90 a year to £190.10 a year in the case of officers and from £3.15 a week to £3.50 a week in the case of ratings, and in respect of each other child from £145.90 a year to £164.10 a year in the case of officers and from £2.65 a week to £3.00 a week in the case of ratings, where the child qualifies for a family allowance, and from £164.10 a year to £182.30 a year in the case of officers and from £3.00 a week to £3.55 a week in the case of ratings, where the child qualifies for a family allowance, and from £164.10 a year to £182.30 a year in the case of officers and from £3.00 a week to £3.35 a week in the case of ratings where the child does not so qualify;

Other benefits

- (p) the maximum pensions payable to certain widowers from £412.00 a year to £464.00 a year in the case of officers and from £7.80 a week to £8.80 a week in the case of ratings;
- (q) the rates of pensions and allowances payable to or in respect of the children of deceased members of the naval forces (such children having become motherless or having ceased to be under the control of their mothers) in respect of the first or only child or any other child who does not qualify for a family allowance from £251·10 a year to £269·30 a year in the case of children of officers and from £3·15 or £4·65 a week to £3·50 or £5·00 a week (according to the age of the child) in the case of children of atings, and in respect of each other child who qualifies for family allowance from £25·10 a year to £243·30 a year in the case of children of officers and from £2·50 or £4·55 a week to £3·00 or £4·55 a week (according to the age of the child) in the case of children of atings;

- Article 2 makes amendments to the 1964 Order, the effects of which are :---

- (b) to raise the maximum amount of earnings which may be received by a member while deemed to be unemployable for the purposes of an award of unemployability allowance from £104 a year to £234 a year;
- (c) to enable the maximum rate of additional allowances payable in respect of the children of a member receiving treatment as defined in Article 21(8) to be awarded in cases where the member would not otherwise qualify for such an award solely by reason of his age, in cases where the member is in receipt of an unemployability allowance and in certain cases where the member is not eligible for retirement pension;
- (d) to enable the rate of rent allowance to be determined by reference to the amount of weekly rent and rates instead of as hitherto the amount by which the weekly rent and rates exceed 30p.

Article 3 extends the Secretary of State's discretionary power to make deductions from awards in respect of maintenance in an institution supported out of public funds to all cases where the pensioner is maintained free of charge in a National Health Service hospital or similar institution for the purpose of receiving treatment and provides for payments out of such deductions to be made to the pensioner for his resettlement following a period of such treatment.
