Hamlyns Mill, follows the north-east boundary of the mill property, crosses the river and follows its east bank to a point 200 feet from the Bollin Bridge. The line turns north-east and follows the rear of the property fronting Bridge Green for 600 feet, turns north for 470 feet, then due west to meet New Road.
