

Shore Cottage, and including the group of cottages west of The Common.

Grundisburgh Parish—(part)

The central part of the village, including the buildings and gardens and curtilages in and adjoining the road through the centre of the village, extending from the Ipswich Road/Charles Avenue junction in the south-west to the Half Moon and the entrance to Jacqueline Close in the south-east, and extending north-eastwards of Grundisburgh House, across the Burgh Road (B.1079).

Higham Parish—(part)

The main built-up central part of the village including the buildings and gardens and curtilages in and adjoining Lower Street from Higham Bridge eastwards to The Green, and thence southwards to include The Old Guildhall and eastwards for about 80 yards beyond The King's Head.

Stratford St. Mary Parish—(part)

The main built-up part of the village including the buildings and gardens and curtilages in and adjoining the former main road (Lower Street and Upper Street) from the Weaver's House and the Black Horse Inn in the south to School Lane in the north-east; also the houses and gardens in Tally-ho Corner, and the Parish Church and neighbouring houses and farmhouses near the Church.

Description of the land comprised in the application

Approximately 491 acres of land or thereabouts centred mainly on Acklington Airfield and situated south of Acklington Village and north-west of Acklington Prison, together with a narrow strip for the purposes of a private access road southwards from the airfield through Chevington Wood on the east side and parallel with the Newcastle—Edinburgh Railway for a distance of about three miles to the existing Widdrington Coal Disposal Point.
