

this Place, with a confirmation of the entire Defeat of the Swedish Army. That Gentlemen left the Muscovite Camp on the 20th of July. O. S. and saye, that the Czar was then marching in Person with thirty thousand Men towards Poland, having writ to King Augustus forthwith to advance into that Kingdom. He adds, that the King of Sweden was escaped into Crim Tartary, with a Train not exceeding sixty Persons; and that a Body of eight hundred Men, which made a stand on the Banks of the Boristhenes, to favour their Master's Escape, were all killed or taken. The King of Sweden's Chirurgion is among the Prisoners, who reports, that his Majesty received a Wound in the Foot by a Musket-Ball, eight Days before the Battel. The Number of the Prisoners taken by the Muscovites, including both Cossacks and Swedes, amounts to twenty two thousand Men. His Czariſh Majesty hath ordered his Minister residing here to signify the Particulars of this Victory to the States. Letters from France say, there was lately a great Insurrection of the poor People of Paris for want of bread, who ran together in great Numbers, plundering several Shups and Houses; but that the Tumult was soon appeas'd by the Governor of that City.

Falmouth, August 18. On the 16th Instant came in the Prince Packet boat in twenty days from Lisbon, in which arriv'd the Lord Barrimore on his Parole. Yesterday appeared off our Harbour, the Neptune Privateer of Middleburg, which sent in a French Sloop laden with Sugar. This day is come in the Welch Fleet, under Command of the Southampton and Lizard. The Newfoundland Fleet past by this Harbour yesterday.

Dartmouth, August 19. Yesterday in the Afternoon Rear-Admiral Baker, with all the outward-bound Fleet, sailed from Torbay to the Westward, the Wind at South east, and all this Day at North-east, so that we hope they will all get safe out of the Channel. This Morning several Sail of Ships past by this Port to the Westward, which we suppose to be the New-England Fleet from Spithead.

Plimouth, Aug. 19. On the 17th Instant fail'd the Dover and Strombulo, with twenty Sail for Newfoundland and Guiney; and the Southampton and Lizard, with about a hundred Sail for Wales. Yesterday came in the Nottingham from the Downs, and the Patience of Arundel for the Dock. This Day came in the Lancaster and Chatham, with seventeen Sail for Ireland; and the Marvellous with Prisoners from France. Came in, and sail'd, the Chester, with seven Sail for New-England, and the Pearl Packet-boat for the West-Indies.

Portsmouth, August 20. On Thursday last her Majesty's Ships the Chester and Lancaster sail'd from St. Helens to the Westward, with about forty Sail of Merchantmen and Coasters under their Convoy. At the same time, the Rose Pink sail'd to the Westward through the Needles. The same day also the Cruiser came into our Harbour; at which time the Nottingham sail'd by to the Westward.
