On the morning of 18th May 1972, a team of Service Personnel was sent to deal with a bomb threat in the Queen Elizabeth II which at that time was in mid-Atlantic on her way to Europe. To get the team on board the ship a parachute drop into the sea was necessary.

The two Royal Marines members of the team were responsible for ensuring that the two Army bomb disposal experts together with their equipment arrived on board the ship; thereafter they were to assist them in locating and dealing with any bombs that might have been aboard.

During the flight it was discovered that Captain Williams had little parachuting experience and none of parachuting into the sea.

On arrival over the ship weather conditions were found to be adverse and it was necessary for the aircraft to carry out several trial runs before the jumps could be made.

The team faced three problems: the presence of an inexperienced parachutist, adverse weather condi-tions requiring a drop from minimum height through cloud, and the carriage of unusually heavy and bulky loads. There is no doubt that under ordinary condi-tions the mission would have been abandoned but in view of its urgency and importance it was decided to proceed with the operation despite the risks to those involved.

On the fourth run over the ship Staff Sergeant Oliver and Corporal Jones dropped with the heavy equipment and on the seventh run the two officers dropped. Lieutenant Clifford supervised Captain William's parachute drill and when they arrived in the sea he supported him until they were picked up. Once on board, the team immediately started their

search of the ship and the suspect cargo. The courage and determination of all four members of the team in the face of unusual and hazardous conditions resulted in the successful execution of this

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for Wales has appointed Mr. R. H. Austin, M.B.E., F.I.C.E., M.I.Mun.E., to hold a Public Local Inquiry in connection with the above-mentioned Orders commencing at 10.30 a.m. on 17th October 1972 at the Scout Hall, St. Agnes Road, Gabalfa, Cardiff.

The first said Order would, if made,

(a) provide that the road which the Secretary of State proposes to construct near that part of the Cardiff-Llangurig Trunk Road known as Merthyr Road in the City of Cardiff shall become a trunk road when that Order comes into operation;
