NOTICE OF SEIZURE UNDER THE CUSTOMS AND EXCISE ACT 1952

To: ERIC LUFF BARRINGTON, Box 5316,
Station A, Toronto, Ontario.

Pursuant to section 275 (5) of the Customs and Excise Act 1952 and paragraph 1 of the 7th Schedule thereto, the Commissioners of Customs and Excise hereby give you notice that by virtue of the powers contained in the customs and excise Acts and enactments amending those Acts, certain goods, namely, a National transistor tape recorder have been seized as liable to forfeiture upon the grounds that the said goods being imported goods chargeable with a duty of customs were without payment of that duty removed from their place of importation otherwise than as provided by or under the Customs and Excise Act 1952.

Whereby and by force of section 44 (a) of the Customs and Excise Act 1952 the said goods are liable to forfeiture.

If you claim that the said goods are not liable to forfeiture you must within one month from the date of this notice of seizure give notice of your claim in accordance with the said Schedule to the said Act specifying the name and address of a solicitor in England who is authorised to accept service of process and to act on your behalf. In default of such notice the said goods will be deemed to have been duly condemned as forfeited and will be liable to be disposed of in such manner as the Commissioners of Customs and Excise may direct. If you make such claim within the time aforesaid, legal proceedings will be taken for the condemnation thereof.

NOTICE OF SEIZURE UNDER THE CUSTOMS AND EXCISE ACT 1952

Pursuant to section 275 (5) of the Customs and Excise Act 1952 and paragraph 1 of the 7th Schedule thereto, the Commissioners of Customs and Excise hereby give you notice that by virtue of the powers contained in the customs and excise Acts and enactments amending those Acts, certain goods, namely, 4 cartons containing 491 gramophone records and 12 tapes have been seized as liable to forfeiture upon the grounds that the said goods were goods in relation to which you or, in the alternative, Tony Alexander Associates (U.K.) Ltd. knowingly caused to be delivered to an officer a document, namely a copy invoice for the purpose of an assigned matter, namely Customs, which was untrue in a material particular in that it falsely stated that the total price of the said goods was \$235 whereas the correct price was greater than that amount.
