Plymonth, April 3.

His day arrived here the Edward and Mary of Dover, intending for the Ganaries, and the Fohn and Irancis of Hampton for the Madera's and New England.

Here is also come in the Ruth of this place from Bayonne, laden with Wine and Brandy.

Warfaw, March 21. The Affembly of the States fill continues, but have as yet made little advance into any affairs of importance. This laft week was fpent by them in making Inquiry into the vacant Charges, which they defire may be speedily filled up, refusing to enter upon any other businets till this be done, in which if they are not complyed with, they threaten to return home, and to break up the Diet.

On Tuesday last the Equestrian Order went in a Body to the House of the Senators, where His Majesty was then prefent, where the Pasta Conventa were read to them; at the reading of the last Article, which imported, that if the King did not rightly and duely perform on his part what he had promised by the faid agreement, that then they were discharged from their allegiance; they all with a loud voice fignified their approbations.

The Arch-Bishop of Gnesne and the Crowns General, have not yet appeared at the Diet.

The Equestrian Order having defired the difmission of Torreign Ministers to whom they usually attribute the Cause of all their difagreements, the Count de Schargotz the Emperours Ambassadour immediately left the place and is returned home.

Here is lately arrived a meffenger with Letters from the Great Duke of *Mufcovy* to his Majefty, but the bufinels of them not yet known.

His Majefty has amongft other things, propoled to the Diet the Queens Coronation, which he supposed might be performed at Warfaw, to avoyd the Trouble and expence ofgoing to Gracow, defiring that care might be taken for the fixing of a Revenue for the maintenance of her houshold, according to the practice of former times.

Rome, March 22. On Sunday last a party of the Cardinals began to cast their Eyes upon Odefchalchi as a perfon not vnfit. to be promoted to the fupreme Dignity, who being acquainted with it, modefly advised them to confider what they went about in his nomination, least they raight afterwards too late repent of their kindaels to him, fince many things had been done by former Popes, which were he in the Chayr, he could not tollerate, but this his Declaration winning upon the generality of the Cardinals, On Wednefday he had gotten fo great a party, that his Election was not doubted, and fome of the Cardinals were already providing to leave the Conclave 1 he having the Spanish pret on his fide, with Cardinal Chigi; Gardlnal Fransife Barbarini and Refpigliefi favouring alfo his Election, but that the Squadronids were not to eafily to be gained by him, as feating he would prove too levere and rigid in the Cháir.

The perfon who most appeared against him was Cardinal Imperiale, in memory of his advice given to Alexunder VII. about the business of the French Ambashadour Grequi, to remove him from the Court of Rome. The French party instantly acquainted the Duke de Chaulmes of what had pass in Order to this choice; who has defired the suffernion of their Voyces, till be had first by a Courier sounded the King his Masters inclinations towards it.

The Cardinals Antonio Barbarini, Pullavicini Bonelli and Spada, are again returned into the Conclave, but Cardinal Ludovifio ftill refuses to enter till the Election be fully agreed on, Intending then to comply with the prevalent party, and to make his adoration according to Custom.

The Cardinals Nerli and Albisi, were about the fame time nominated by the sequationists, but Cardinal Chigy being much offended with the Exclusion of the Cardinals, his Creatures makes use of all his intereft to oppole any of their nomination.

The Cardinals Barbarin, de Medici, and de Retz, have telolved to proceed fincerely and unanimoufly to the Election. Gardinal Chigi has lated afide all his hopes of prevailing for any of his own C. catures, profeffing his readinefs to comply for the Election of any Perform who shall be judged fitteft to fucceed, with respect to the Service of God, and the Interest of the Church, fo as they are not declared enemies to his Family. Those of his Faction declared their inclinations to many of the Old Cardinals, but will not eafily give their Suffrages to any of the younger.

The Colledge being informed, That a party of the Bandiri had made an Inroad into the Ecclefiaftical State bordering upon the Kingdom of Maples, and p'undered feveral Houfes immediately gave Order for the March of 300 Souldiers rowards those parts, and have defined the Viceroy of Naples 10 Command out fome Forces for the fuppreffion of those 1 hieres.

Legorn, March 24. The 19th inftam arrived here the Prudent Mary from Morea and Zante, the Katherine from Zante, the Delight, the two Brothers and Unity from Puglia, and departed again the 20th for Genoua, to find Convoy on their retark home.

The 19th arrived the Lewis from England, Marfeilles, and Genoua, and the 22th the Mary from Eng and and Genoua.

This day came in the John and Thoman, and the David and Ianashan Pinke in 16 dayes from Zante; they were five Ships of them when they departed thence, but, off the Welt of Sicily they met with four Men of Warr of Algiers, who, after a fharp Encounter of three or four hours, took the Merchants Deligh; the Contord and the Submilsion, which lalt was afterwards by fome accident fee on fire. Two of the Tyrks were also coming on board the John and Thomas, but, finding him well Gunned, and fuppoting him to be a Man of Warr, turned away; but, finding afterwards their misske, three Algerines made after him, and forted him to run on thore, which lectured him.

Whith this unhappy accident happened, Sir to Harman whs with his Squadron riding in his Station off Meffind, expecting their return, who were it feens intercepted by the Zurks on their way.

This motning arrived, the Isrufalem, a Ship of this place, in 27 dayes from Smyrna.

The Dutch Convoy for Smyrna may depart in two days, as may also the Lewis for Scanderson.

The Grest Dake has not yet left Pild, and, ris now fuppoled he will return immediately to Florence, without giving a visit to this plate.

Milan, March 26. The Duke d' Offunta continued fiil at Finale, where he has been complimented from the Marquils de los Balbases Spinola. The Principal Officers *Civil* and *Military*, daily move rowards the Frontires, to pay their Respects to the new Governour, who is not expected here till the wayes be first repaired, and made passable.

The Army has been lately Mustered, and the Souldiers are again difinist to their respective Quarters ; we daily expect here the list of them, that so a true judgment may be made of the strength of this Government.

The Sicar Gafpar Baretta, the Principal Ingineer, is preparing for his Journey into Sicily, to take a view of the Fortifications of that Kingdom.

Fienna, March 29. From Hungary we are informed, That fome of the difcontented People of that Kingdom had lent fome perfort, as their Deputies, to Treat with the Grand Seignior, and to offer Propolitions for Obedience to him; but, that they were returned with an Anfwer ligtle pleafing to them, which put them upon other Counfels, and obliged, a confiderable part of them to fubmit themfelves to the Emperour; and, its believ'd the others will think fit to follow their example.

They farther fay, That upon the Orders given for the Marching of the Emperours Forces into *Croatia*, Count *Peter Serini*, who had before been in Treaty with the Tarks, dispatcht a Monk to the Emperour with his fubmiffions, defiring His Pardon ; which His Imperial Majefty has readily given him, but the Forces Order'd to March into *Croatia*, are not remanded.

His Imperial Majefly has conferred the Charge of Genetal of the Forces of Stiria upon Count Ferdinand Erneft d' Herberftiers, and given Commission to the Count d' Ardedi for the railing of three Regiments of Croates.

The Count of Tatenback, who was concerned with Count serini in the intended defection, is feized on in Croatia, and committed Priloner to the Cittadel of Gratz in Stiria: Thole who were employed to feize him, found in his Houle leveral thouland Armes, and 100 thouland Crowns in, Money. This Newes is received here with much fatisfaction, and hopes that the Evils which fo much shreatned us on that fide, are by this meanes in great meahere prevented.

His Imperial Majefty has been pleafed to give the Irwes a longer time, till Michaelmas next, poretire themfelves out of His Dominions.

Bruffells, Apr. 9. We begin now to lay aside all apprehensions of any danger designed us, by the Visit His Most Christian Majesty intends to make to his New Conquests, and a strict Command is given both in the Spanish and French Quarters, prohibiting all discurses of that Nature, which might occasion any Jealouske amongs the People.

Our Camp-Mafter-General continues the Fortification of *Ipres*, and intends not to remove from thence until the Cittadel and other Works there be completed. This laft week pafied by *Bruges* above 100 Waggons laden with Ammunition and Sto es intended for that place, and this day are to be fent thither \$2 Great Pieces of Canon, to be planted upon the Cittadel.

The forces in Brabant have removed generally to fresh Quarters. The Constable of Casiile expects to be fuddenly succeeded in this Government, and tis suppofed Don Huan may be prevailed to accept thereof.

fed Don Juan may be prevailed to accept thereof. Bruffels, april 12. Count Marsin having left the Cittadel and Fortifications at Ipres nearly compleated, the place well flored and provided with Ammunition, Attillery, and all other neceffaries, with a Garrison of 4000 Foot, and a ftrong-body of Horle for the defence of that place is gone thence to Bruges, and has fince visited Diamid, and given his neceffary Orders for the fecutity of that place allo.

On Saturday arrived here the Count de Monterey from Autworp, and the next day went to the Palaco to attend the Constable of Castille, but his indisposition permitted him not to receive Vists. The Duke de Villa Hermofs is expected here about the end of this Moneth, to take polleffion of his Charge, as Lieutenant General of the Horfe, which is too the prelent (upplyed by Don Antonio de Gerdona. From Ratonne we are informed, That the Sieur de

From Paronae we are infommen, That the Sicur de Rubentel qualter'd there on Saiurder Joil, on his way from Paris, with twelve Companies of his Most Christian Majettics Guards intended for Lille, and will be fuddenly followed by a Convoy with cloaths and Musquets for 10000 Mer.

The French continue their Fortification at Arth, Where they daily employ above 1500 Men; they have there propoled the pulling down the Cittizens Houles, and rebuilding them in a form more (uitable, and p oper for a Fortify'd Town.

We have had frequent complaints made by the Citizens of this place, of many diforders committed by the Spanish Souldiers, notwithstanding the care taken to keep them under a more fevere Difcipline.

On Tuesday his Excellency gave out his Orders for iffuing out a months pay to all the forces within his Government.

The Chancellour of Brabant, and the Sieur Arguemans a Member of the Vrivy Councel, have begammer Conferences with the Deputies from the States of Holland, about the differences between them and the Admiralty of Offend.

Paris April 12. After the lolemn Baptime of Madamoifelle de Vallos the 8th infont, at which were prefere both their Majeflies and Royal Hightefles, with the Princeof Conde Duke and Durchefs of Enguy, n, the Princeof Conde Duke and Carignan, Will all the perfons of the gratefl quality about the Town, where the 'Dauphin and Madamoifelle d' Orkans gave her' the nome of Ann , the Court returned the fame night to St.¹ Germains, His Majefly having first taken a view of the Triumphal arch, Erected in the Suburbs of St Anthonies, with fome other, buildings effectably those at the Lowwite.
