(v) In Schedule 4 paragraph 2, there shall be inserted as sub-section (f), with effect from 1st April 1972, the rates of Royal Marines Air Gunners Pay in paragraph f of Schedule 1 to this Order, and

(vi) For Schedule 5 paragraph 2 (which was amended by paragraph 2 of Schedule 1 to the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions (Pay and Allowances) (Third Amendment) Order 1971 and by paragraph 2 of Schedule 1 to the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions (Pay and Allowances) (Second Amendment) Order 1972) there shall be substituted, with effect from 1st April 1972, paragraph g of Schedule 1 to this Order.

(2) The said Order shall be further amended, with effect from 1st May 1972, by inserting as Schedule 8 to that Order the table of relative Naval ranks of Chaplains of all denominations and of officers of the Royal Marines for the purpose of the payment of allowances in Schedule 2 to this Order.

4. The rates in Schedule 1 to this Order shall be read as daily rates.
