CROMER URBAN DISTRICT COUNCIL COAST PROTECTION ACT, 1949

ROAD TRAFFIC ACTS

BEDFORDSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL

The Bedfordshire County Council (Various Roads, Toddington) (Prohibition and Restriction of Wait-ing) Order, 1972.
