Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order made on the 3rd November 1972 is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation or to be confirmed by the Bradford City Council as an unopposed Order.

The effect of the Order if confirmed without modification will be to extinguish the public rights of way across land situate between Planetrees Road and Laisterdyke.

If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State any representations or objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be sent with the Order.

COUNTRYSIDE ACT 1968*Rural District Council of Hambledon in the County of Surrey. The Hambledon Rural District Council Public Path No. 443 Diversion Order 1971.*

Notice is hereby given that on the 23rd October 1972, the Rural District Council of Hambledon confirmed the above-named Order.

The effect of the Order will be to divert public bridleway No. 443, which runs in a south-westerly direction from Horsham Lane at Ellens Green in the parish of Ewhurst through land known as the Ewhurst Brickworks, the bridleway skirting close to the main buildings of the said brickworks and then carrying on in a south-easterly direction through Somersbury Wood, the length of the bridleway to be diverted being approximately 416 yards, to a line which will run from the Horsham Lane commencing west of the post and rail fence of the culvert under the Horsham Lane being a distance approximately 50 yards east of the existing access, then proceeding in a south-easterly direction for approximately 50 yards on the western side of the watercourse, then turning a right angle and proceeding in a westerly direction for approximately 67 yards on the northern side of the hedge and ditch, then turning a right angle and proceeding in a south-easterly direction for approximately 83 yards on the western side of the hedge, then proceeding in a south-westerly direction for approximately 267 yards along the western side of the watercourse, then joining the line of the existing bridleway.

A copy of the Order as confirmed and the map contained in it has been deposited and may be inspected free of charge at the offices of the Rural District Council of Hambledon at Bury Fields, Guildford, Surrey between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. on any weekday (Monday to Friday inclusive).

The Order becomes operative as from 16th November 1972, but if a person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof, or of any provision contained therein, on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act 1959, as amended, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act, as amended, or of any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the Order he may, under paragraph 2 of Schedule 2 to the Act as applied by paragraph 5 of Schedule 7 to the Act, within 6 weeks from the 2nd November 1972 make application for the purpose to the High Court.
