*The Chesterfield Rural District Council (Parish of Killamarsh Footpath No. 14) Diversion Order, 1972.*

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") made on the 8th November 1972, is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation or to be confirmed by the Rural District Council of Chesterfield as an unopposed Order.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modification, will be to divert the public right of way running from a point in Westfield Road, Killamarsh, opposite to the western end of Beech Crescent in a generally north-westerly direction for a distance of approximately 100 yards to a point at the western end of Cherry Tree Drive, Killamarsh, to a line running from the before mentioned point in Westfield Road along footpaths to be constructed along Westfield Road and Cherry Tree Drive, Killamarsh.

*Rural District Council of Dartford (Footpath 101 (Part) Wilmington) Public Path Diversion Order 1972 No. 3.*

Notice is hereby given that on the 7th November 1972 the Rural District of Dartford confirmed the above-named Order as an unopposed Order.

The effect of the Order, as confirmed without modification, will be to divert that length of Footpath 101, Wilmington, leading from Hawley Road (A.225) on its southern side approximately 57 yards east of the centre of Warren Road, and leading in a south-westerly direction for an approximate distance of 48 yards to the rear boundary of the properties fronting Hawley Road to a new length of footpath commencing from the southern side of Hawley Road (A.225) at a point approximately 60 yards east of the centre of Warren Road and leading in a south-westerly direction for approximately 48 yards outside the new south-eastern boundary of 142 Hawley Road to the rear boundary of 142 Hawley Road then turning in a north-westerly direction for approximately 3 yards to join the existing footpath.

A copy of the confirmed Order and the map contained in it has been deposited at White Oak, Swanley, Kent, and may be inspected free of charge between the hours of 10 a.m. and 4 p.m., Monday to Friday.

The Order becomes operative from the 10th November 1972, but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971 or on the ground that any requirement of that Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the confirmation of the Order, he may under section 178 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1962 within 6 weeks from the 11th November 1972 make application for the purpose to the High Court.
