## NOTICE OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT, 1971,  
SECTION 210*The County Council of Essex (Footpath 10, Broomfield) Public Path Diversion Order, 1972*

Notice is hereby given that on 30th October 1972, the Essex County Council confirmed the above-named Order. The effect of the Order as confirmed is to divert the public right of way running generally southwards from a point approximately 71 feet south of the Broomfield Hospital entrance (point A on the map contained in the said Order) for an approximate distance of 726 feet to a line running from the said point A in an easterly direction for approximately 450 feet, thence southwards for approximately 950 feet and finally westerly for approximately 700 feet.

A copy of the confirmed Order and the map contained in it has been deposited at and may be inspected free of charge at the office of the Clerk of the County Council, County Hall, Chelmsford, between 9 a.m. and 5.30 p.m., on Mondays to Fridays.

This Order becomes operative as from the date of confirmation i.e., 30th October 1972, and the diversion becomes effective when the replacement highway is provided to the satisfaction of the County Council. If any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Town and Country Planning Act, 1971, or on the ground that any requirement of that Act or any Regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the confirmation of the Order, he may under section 244 of the Town and Country Planning Act, 1971, within six weeks from 10th November 1972, make application for the purpose to the High Court.

It includes the area south of Church Road between the River Chater and the public footpath to Barrowden Road. It also covers the meadow land south of the River Chater, stretching as far as the level crossing towards Geeston along Station Road, the western edge being marked by the footpath to Barrowden Road and the eastern edge by the limits of the new development along Edmunds Drive.

It also includes the area of Aldgate, beyond the bridge over the River Chater, which is bounded by farmland to the north and east by the River Chater to the west and the road towards Ketteron House to the south.
