The Trunk Roads (Restricted Roads) (Wales) (No.) Order 1972

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for Wales intends to make an Order under sections 72 and 73 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, the effect of which will be that no person shall drive any motor vehicle at a speed exceeding 30 m.p.h. on that length of the London—Fishguard Trunk Road (A.48), known as Chepstow Inner Relief Road at Chepstow in the County of Monmouth, which extends from its junction with Station Road in a south-westerly direction to its junction with Mount Pleasant, a distance of 387 yards.

The Trunk Road (Tenby Road, Cardigan) (One-Way Traffic) Order, 1972

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for Wales intends to make an Order under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act, 1968, the effect of which will be that no person shall cause any vehicle to proceed in a direction other than from north-west to south-east in that length of the Fishguard—Aberystwyth—Dolgellau—Caernarvon—Bangor (Menai Suspension Bridge) Trunk Road (A.487), known as Tenby Road in the Borough of Cardigan, which extends from its junction with the Tenby—Cardigan road, A.478, in a north-westerly direction for a distance of 44 yards.

A copy of the proposed Order, together with a plan, may be inspected during normal office hours at the offices of the Cardigan Borough Council, Cardigan.

Y SWYDDFA GYMREIG

The Trunk Road (Pyle) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1972

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State has made an Order under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, the effect of which is to prohibit waiting on either of the sides of road specified in the Schedule to this Order.

Exceptions have been provided in the Order to enable a vehicle to wait for so long as may be necessary for a person to board or alight from the vehicle; to enable goods to be loaded onto or unloaded from the vehicle; to enable the vehicle to be used in connection with any building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance

of the road or the services therein; or to enable the vehicle to be used in the service of a local authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties.

Copies of the Order may be obtained, free of charge, on application to the Secretary of State, Welsh Office, Roads Division (Y Swyddfa Gymreig, Adran Ffyrdd), Graham Buildings, 139 Newport Road, Cardiff, CF2 1YU, quoting the reference R15/228/24.

If you wish to question the validity of the Order or any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, or that any requirement of that Act or of any instrument made under it, has not been complied with in relation to the Order, you may within 6 weeks of the 6th November 1972 apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained therein.

The west side of that length of the London—Fishguard Trunk Road (A.48), known as Pyle Road, at Pyle in the County of Glamorgan, which extends from a point 35 yards north-west of the north side of its junction with Ffald Road to a point 90 yards north-west of that junction, a distance of 55 yards.

2. The east side of that length of the London—Fishguard Trunk Road (A.48), known as Pyle Road, at Pyle in the county of Glamorgan, which extends from a point 35 yards north-west of the north side of its junction with Ffald Road to a point 71 yards north-west of that junction, a distance of 36 yards.

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT, 1971

Pedestrianisation of Roads at Merthyr Tydfil

The Secretary of State for Wales hereby gives notice that he proposes, on the application of the Merthyr Tydfil County Borough Council, to make an Order under section 212 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971, for extinguishing any rights which persons may have to use vehicles on those lengths of road specified in the Schedule to this notice.

The proposed Order will contain provisions for permitting the use of those highways by vehicles being used:

- in pursuance of statutory powers or duties if that vehicle cannot be conveniently used for such purpose in any other road; or
- in accordance with the special authorisation for that use given by or on behalf of the County Borough Council of Merthyr Tydfil, or the Chief Officer of Police for the South Wales Constabulary; or
- where the vehicle is an invalid carriage (electrically, mechanically or hand propelled), a vehicle which has been issued to a disabled person by the Welsh Office in lieu of an invalid carriage, or a vehicle which bears at the front and rear in conspicuous positions badges issued in accordance with the provisions of the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) Regulations 1971, as amended, or a badge having effect under those amended Regulations as if it were a disabled person's badge.

During 28 days from the 16th November 1972, copies of the draft Order and relevant plan may be inspected at all reasonable hours at the offices of the Merthyr Tydfil County Borough Council, Town Hall, Merthyr Tydfil, and may be obtained free of charge from the Secretary of State (quoting the reference number R15/235/4) at the address stated below.

Within the above-mentioned period of 28 days any person may by notice to the Secretary of State (reference R15/235/4), Welsh Office, Roads Division, (Y Swyddfa Gymreig, Adran Ffyrdd), Graham Buildings, 139 Newport Road, Cardiff CF2 1YU, object to the making of the Order.

Description of highways to which this notice relates (the distances stated are approximate). The highways are situated in the County Borough of Merthyr Tydfil in the County of Glamorgan.

1. That length of High Street which extends from its junction with Central Street in a southerly direction to its junction with Swan Street, a distance of 175 yards.
