ARNOLD URBAN DISTRICT COUNCIL

The Urban District of Arnold (High Street/Wood Street/Wellington Street) (Experimental Prohibition of Waiting) Order, 1972.

The Bushey (Sandy Lane) (Prescribed Routes) Order 1972

BRISTOL CITY AND COUNTY COUNCIL

The Bristol (Street Parking Places) Order 1972
