- 2. The effect of the Order which comes into effect on the 26th November 1972 is as follows:
 - To prohibit the driving of vehicles in the following lengths of road in a direction other than that specified:
 - St. Peter's Street, the western carriageway between its junctions with St. Peter's Churchyard and Victoria Street, from south to north.
 - St. Peter's Street, the eastern carriageway between its junctions with St. Peter's Churchyard and Babington Lane, from north to south.

Babington Lane, the south-eastern carriageway between its junctions with St. Peter's Street and Gower Street, from north-east to south-west.

East Street, between its junctions with St. Peter's Street and Exchange Street, from southwest to north-east.

St. Peter's Churchyard, between its junctions with Green Lane and St. Peter's Street, from west to east.

Gower Street, between its junctions with Babington Lane and Green Lane, from east to west.

Osmaston Road, the eastern carriageway be-tween its junctions with Wilmot Street and Bradshaw Way, from north to south.

Green Lane, between its junctions with Gower Street and Macklin Street, from south to north.

Green Lane, between its junctions with Victoria Street and St. Peter's Churchyard, from north to south.

Macklin Street, between its junctions with Green Lane and Colyear Street, from east to west.

Green Lane, from its junction with Burton Road and Babington Lane to a point 80 feet north of that junction, from north to south.

(2) To prohibit the driving of vehicles other than public service vehicles in the following lengths of carriageway and to provide for such vehicles

to be driven in those carriageways only in the direction specified:

- St. Peter's Street, the eastern carriageway between its junctions with St. Peter's Church-yard and Victoria Street, from north to south.
- St. Peter's Street, the western carriageway between its junctions with St. Peter's Churchyard and Babington Lane, from south to north.

Babington Lane, the north-western carriageway between its junctions with St. Peter's Street and Gower Street, from south-west to north-east.

Osmaston Road, the western carriageway between its junctions with Wilmot Street and Bradshaw Way, from south to north.

- (3) To prohibit vehicles from making a left hand turn into St. Peter's Street from Albert Street; and to require vehicles being driven in Green Lane between its junctions with Victoria Street and St. Peter's Churchyard to turn left into St. Peter's Churchyard.
- (4) To revoke the County Borough of Derby (Traffic Regulation) (No. 1) Order 1934 relating to Green Lane, the County Borough of Derby (Traffic Regulation) (No. 1) Order 1947 relating to East Street, and the Derby Corporation (Green Lane and Victoria Street) (No Right Hand Turn) Order 1959 relating to Green Lane.
