ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1967

The Trunk Road (Various Roads, Loughborough)
(Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting, Loading

and unloading) Order 1972.

The Secretary of State for the Environment has made an Order under sections 1 and 84D of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, the effect of which is to revoke and re-enact the restrictions relating to the waiting, loading and unloading of vehicles on the A6 Trunk Road in the Borough of Loughborough, Leicestershire.

Leicestershire. In addition the Order prohibits waiting:

(a) at all times instead of between 8 a.m. and 8 p.m. on the north-east side of The Rushes and Swan Street from Shakespeare Street to 30 yards north-west of Church Gate;

(b) between 8 a.m. and 6 p.m.:

(i) on the north-east side of Leicester Road from Factory Street to King Street;

(ii) on the south-west side of Leicester Road from 32 yards south-east of Southfield Road to King Street; and

King Street; and
(c) for more than 30 minutes (no return within 30 minutes) between 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. on the north-east side of Leicester Road from 31 yards south-east of Barrow Street to Factory Street.

Exemptions have been provided in the Order to enable a vehicle to wait for so long as may be necessary for a person to board or alight from the vehicle, to enable goods to be loaded on to or unloaded from the vehicle except, as in the case of (a) above, where a peak hour loading ban already exists, or to enable the vehicle to be used in connection with any building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance of the road or the services therein. The Order exempts disabled persons' vehicles where limited waiting is in force.

Any person who desires to question the validity of, or of any provision contained in, the Order, on the ground that it is not within the powers with resthe ground that it is not within the powers with respect to the Order conferred by the above Act, or on the ground that any requirement of, or of any instrument made under, any provision of that Act has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may within 6 weeks of the 27th November 1972, apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained therein.

ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1967 The Trunk Road (Prohibition of Waiting) (Clear-Ways)

The Secretary of State for the Environment proposes to make an Order under sections 1 (1), (2) and (3) and (6) and 84D (1) of the Road Traffic Regulation

Act 1967 as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, the effect of which will be:

(1) to prohibit waiting on any of those main carriageways forming part of the Exeter—Leeds Trunk Road (A.38) which are specified in the

Schedule hereto; and

(2) to prohibit waiting by any vehicle for the purpose of trading, unless the goods are immediately delivered at or taken into premises adjacent to the vehicle, or on any verge or lay-by adjacent to the said main carriageway.

The prohibition imposed by the Order will not apply:

(a) to a vehicle waiting upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform;(b) so as to prevent a vehicle from being used in

connection with any building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance of the road or of any of the services therein;

(c) to a vehicle being used for fire brigade, am-

bulance or police purposes;

(d) to a vehicle being used for the purpose of delivery or collecting postal packets;

(e) to a vehicle being used by or on behalf of a local authority for the purpose of collecting

household refuse or clearing cesspools;

(f) to a vehicle waiting while any gate or other barrier at the entrance to premises to which the vehicle requires access or from which it has emerged is being opened or closed, if it is not reasonably practicable for the vehicle to wait elsewhere; and

(g) to a vehicle waiting in any case where the person in control of it:

(i) is required by law to stop;(ii) is obliged to stop to avoid an accident; or(iii) is prevented from proceeding by circumstances outside his control and cannot remove the vehicle from the main carriageway.
