Exceptions will be included (a) to enable a person to board or alight from the vehicle (b) apart from the specific loading bans, for goods to be loaded or unloaded, (c) to enable vehicles to be used in connection with loading operations, road maintenance and other statutory powers or duties, and (d) where limited waiting only is allowed, to enable disabled persons' vehicles to park.

*The Folkestone (Fenner Close to Enbrook Valley) Public Path Diversion Order 1972*

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order (hereafter referred to as "the Order") made on the 30th day of November 1972 is about to be

submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation or to be confirmed by the Council of the Borough of Folkestone as an unopposed Order.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modification, will be to divert the public right of way running from the north end of Fenner Close to Enbrook Valley to a line running from a point approximately 18 metres south of the north end of Fenner Close and proceeding in a generally easterly direction for approximately 55 metres and then in a generally northerly direction for approximately 51 metres to Enbrook Valley.

A copy of the Order and the map contained in it has been deposited at the Town Clerk's Office, Civic Centre, Folkestone and may be inspected free of charge at those offices between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. Mondays to Fridays inclusive.

If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation, any representations and objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be sent to the Secretary of State for the Environment with the Order.

#### *Description of site of existing path*

Footpath 29, the existing footpath is along Solomons Hill. The length to be diverted is from a point on the north side of Northway Service Road to a point on the south side of Northway a total distance of approximately 62 feet.

#### *Description of site of alternative path*

Footpath 29, from a point on the north side of Northway Service Road the new footpath will run westwards, northwards and eastwards along the boundary of the proposed car park to join the existing footpath F.P. 29 on the south side of Northway.

If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State for confirmation any representations and objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be sent to the Secretary of State with the Order.
