The City of Peterborough (Diversion of Footpath Number 41, Oxney Road, Peterborough) Order 1972

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order"), made on the 8th December 1972, is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation, or to be confirmed by the Peterborough City Council as an unopposed Order.

The effect of the Order if confirmed without modification will be to divert that part of the public right of way known as Footpath Number 41 which runs in a north-easterly direction from a point where it now leaves Oxney Road, Peterborough, near its junction with Edgerley Drain Road and shown by a red line on the map annexed to the Order. The new footpath will run from a point 60 metres west of the existing junction with Oxney Road, Peterborough, for a distance of some 365 metres along a course shown by the black line A, B, C on the map annexed to the Order reopening the existing footpath at point C.
