Wycombe Rural District Council (Oakfair Farm, Stokenchurch) Public Path Diversion Order 1972

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order, made on the 4th December 1972, is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation, or to be confirmed as an unopposed Order, by the Wycombe Rural District Council.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modifications, will be to divert the public right of way running in a northerly direction from a point near the northern boundary of Leygrove's Wood at Oakfair Farm in the parish of Stokenchurch for a distance of 890 feet and then in a westerly direction along the access road to Oakfair

Farm for a distance of 580 feet to Bigmore Lane to a line running in a north-westerly direction from a point near the northern boundary of Leygrove's Wood for a distance of 420 feet and then in a northerly direction for a distance of 840 feet to Bigmore Lane.
