*Grimsby Rural District (Parish of Stallingborough—Footpath No. 29) Public Path Diversion Order, 1972*

Notice is hereby given that on 22nd January 1973, the Grimsby Rural District Council confirmed the above-named Order.

The effect of the Order as confirmed is to divert for a distance of approximately 70 yards the public right of way running from the north side of Station Road, Stallingborough, approximately 50 yards north-east of Stallingborough Level Crossing, through O.S. Field 2969 (the field on the northern side of Stallingborough Level Crossing) and thence, via other public rights of way, to Immingham to a line running from the north side of Station Road, Stallingborough, approximately 25 yards north-east of Stallingborough Level Crossing alongside the south-western boundary of proposed housing development to be carried out in O.S. Field 2969 through O.S. Field 2969 where it rejoins the existing footpath and thence, via other public rights of way, to Immingham.

A copy of the confirmed Order and the map contained in it has been deposited at and may be inspected free of charge at Council Offices, Immingham, between 9 a.m. and 5.30 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays.

The Order becomes operative as from the 23rd January 1973, but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Town and Country Planning Act 1968, or on the ground that any requirement of that Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the confirmation of the Order, he may, under section 178 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1962, within 6 weeks from 23rd January 1973, make application for the purpose to the High Court.

*The Grimsby Rural District (Footpath No. 20) Public Path Diversion Order, 1973*

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") made on the 15th January 1973, is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation, or to be confirmed, as an unopposed Order, by the Grimsby Rural District Council.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modifications, will be to divert the public right of way running from Green Lane, which forms a continuation of Blossom Way,

in a south-easterly direction through O.S. Field 2800 for a distance of approximately 160 yards and thence, via a slight deviation, through O.S. Field 3773 for a distance of approximately 300 yards to the south-eastern corner of O.S. Field 3773 to a line running from Green Lane and continuing along the same Green Lane in a south-easterly direction for a distance of approximately 220 yards and thence, via a slight deviation, through inter-connecting housing estate roads and walkways for a distance of approximately 260 yards to the north-western boundary of the adjoining field, O.S. Field 5157, where it rejoins the original line of the footpath.

If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State for confirmation any representations and objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be transmitted with the Order.
