### PRIVY COUNCIL OFFICE

At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 20th day of December 1972.

Present,

The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council

Whereas by section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act 1865 c. 73 it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, wages, pensions, bounty money, grants, or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Her Majesty's naval or marine force to a person being or having been an officer, seaman, or marine, or to the widow or any relative of a deceased officer, seaman, or marine, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions, as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

And whereas it is expedient that a person should not receive half pay, retired pay or pension unless a declaration as prescribed in the Schedule to this Order has been made:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred upon Her as aforesaid, is pleased, by and with

the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

#### Citation

1. This Order may be cited as the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions (Pensions Declaration) Order 1972.

#### Interpretation

2. The Interpretation Act 1889 c.63 shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

#### General

3. This Order shall have effect from 1st March 1972.  
4. The regulations governing the making of a declaration shall be as set out in the Schedule to this Order.

#### SCHEDULE

1. No person may be paid half-pay or a naval pension unless a declaration has been made and signed by the person entitled to receive payment.

2. A declaration shall be required at the time payment of half-pay or pension begins and thereafter at intervals of at least one year and not exceeding three years or at such
