NORTH RIDING OF YORKSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL

The North Riding of Yorkshire County Council (The Hagg, Cotherstone) (Prohibition of Driving) Order, 1973

Notice is hereby given that on the 1st March 1973, the North Riding of Yorkshire County Council made the above-named Order under sections 1 (1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act, 1968, the effect of which is to prohibit vehicular access at all times between the 21st March and 30th September in any year on that length of road known as "The Hagg", Cotherstone in the Rural District of Startforth which extends from the western boundary of "Hagg House" to a point 163 yards in an easterly direction.

The Order which contains exceptions to permit vehicles to enter the road for the purposes of agriculture, conveyance or haulage of timber felled on adjacent land, maintenance of the road, supply of gas, electricity and water, and emergency services, will come into operation on the 21st March 1973.

A copy of the Order and a map showing the road concerned may be examined at County Hall, Northallerton, during normal office hours.

If you wish to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act, 1968, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or of any instrument made under it, has not been complied with in relation to the Order, you may, within 6 weeks from the 1st March 1973, apply to the High Court for this purpose.
