WALSALL COUNTY BOROUGH COUNCIL

THE CLEAN AIR ACT, 1956

The Walsall (No. 16) (Lodge Farm) Smoke Control Order, 1973

Notice is hereby given that the Council of the County Borough of Walsall in exercise of the powers conferred on them by section 11 of the above-mentioned Act on the 22nd January 1973, made an Order entitled the Walsall (No. 16) (Lodge Farm) Smoke Control Order 1973, declaring the area described in the Schedule hereto to be a smoke control area which Order is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation.

Subject to the exemptions provided by the Order and by virtue of section 11 (4) of the Act if, on any day after the Order has come into operation, smoke is emitted from a chimney of any building within the smoke control area the occupier of that building shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding £20 unless he proves that the emission of smoke was not caused by the use of any fuel other than an authorised fuel. The authorised fuels include anthracite, coke and other carbonised fuels, gas and electricity.

If confirmed the Order will not come into operation before 1st January 1974, or before a later date determined by the Secretary of State for the Environment.

Copies of the Order and of the map referred to therein may be inspected free of charge at the Town Clerk's Office, The Council House, Walsall at all reasonable times during the period of seven weeks from the 23rd March 1973.

Within the said period any person who will be affected by the Order may by notice in writing to the Secretary of State for the Environment, Queen Anne's Chambers, Tothill Street, London S.W.1, object to the confirmation of the Order.

SCHEDULE

Lodge Farm

An area of 591.6 acres or thereabouts contained within a continuous line which commences at Clarke's Lane Bridge, Clarke's Lane, and proceeds in a northerly direction along the centre of Clarke's Lane, Sandbeds, and High Road to the bridge over Wyrley and Essington Canal. It continues easterly along the canal and follows the southern boundary of the Willenhall Smoke Control Areas Nos. 7 and 15, to the centre of Bloxwich Lane, continuing along the centre of Bloxwich Lane to its junction with Wolverhampton Road, turning west along the centre of the section of Wolverhampton Road which gives access to the M.6 Motorway, then following the centre of the northern loop of the Wolverhampton Road as it passes over the Motorway, proceeding in a northerly direction along the rear boundary of the houses in Wilkes Avenue to its junction with Churchill Road, then along the rear boundary of Nos. 200-214 Churchill Road, following the westerly boundary of No. 214 Churchill Road to the centre of Churchill Road, along the centre to No. 205, following the westerly boundary of 205 then along the rear boundary of 205 and Nos. 8-14 Kent Road, turning westwards along the rear boundary of 1-67 Edinburgh Avenue. The line then continues in a northerly direction along the side boundary of No. 10 Laburnum Grove, east along the site boundary of No. 11

Laburnum Grove, north along the rear boundaries of 11-20 Laburnum Grove, west along the side boundary of No. 20, northwards along the side boundary of No. 25, west along the rear boundary of No. 25 Laburnum Grove, then northwards along the rear boundaries of 32-38 Lime Avenue, westwards along the side of No. 38 Lime Avenue to the centre of Lime Avenue, continuing southwards along the centre of Lime Avenue to a point opposite No. 21, then west along the front boundaries of Nos. 21 Lime Avenue to 22 Lilac Grove. The line then continues north-westerly along the front boundary of Nos. 23-41 Lilac Grove, then along the rear boundaries of the houses in Everest Road and Atlee Road to No. 112 Poplar Avenue, it then turns eastwards along the side boundary of No. 150 of the centre of Poplar Avenue, east to 195 Poplar Avenue then along the side of No. 195 and then westwards along the rear boundaries of the houses in Poplar Avenue, turning south along the rear boundaries of the houses, and Bentley Primary School in Monmouth Road to the rear boundary of the houses in Churchill Road. The line follows this rear boundary to No. 83 Churchill Road, turns south along the side boundary of No. 83 to the centre of Churchill Road, going down the centre of Churchill Road to its junction with Wolverhampton Road then following the centre of Wolverhampton Road to the County Bridge over the Bentley Canal, following the canal to the starting point at Clarke's Lane.

POST OFFICE

SCHEME T1/1973

NOTE. The Scheme which follows this Note has been made under section 28 of the Post Office Act 1969 and will come into operation on 26th March 1973. It amends the Post Office Telephone Scheme 1972 (Post Office Scheme T3/1972) so as to provide for value added tax to be added to the charges or rentals payable under that Scheme, except the charges for calls made from a call office or a coin box line.

(This Note is not part of the Scheme.)

THE POST OFFICE TELEPHONE AMENDMENT (No. 1) SCHEME 1973

Made - - - - 9th March 1973

Coming into Operation 26th March 1973

The Post Office, by virtue of the powers conferred upon it by section 28 of the Post Office Act 1969, and of all other powers enabling it in this behalf, hereby makes the following Scheme:

Commencement, Citation, and Extent

1.—(1) This Scheme shall come into operation on the 26th day of March 1973 and may be cited as the Post Office Telephone Amendment (No. 1) Scheme 1973.

(2) This Scheme shall apply and extend to the United Kingdom and the Isle of Man.

Interpretation

2.—(1) This Scheme shall be read as one with the Post Office Telephone Scheme 1972 (Post Office Scheme T3/1972) (hereinafter called "the principal Scheme").

(2) The Interpretation Act 1889 applies for the interpretation of this Scheme as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

Value Added Tax

3. After paragraph 47 of the principal Scheme there shall be inserted the following paragraph:

"Value added tax"

47A.—(1) This paragraph applies to every charge or rental in the case of which an amount is specified in or fixed under or continued in force by virtue of the provisions of this Scheme and to every charge or rental which under or by virtue of this Scheme falls to be calculated by reference to a rate or rates so specified or fixed or continued in force, being (in either case) a charge or rental for a supply on which value added tax is chargeable, other than a charge or rate for calls or for
