ANCIENT MONUMENTS ACTS 1913-1953

The Secretary of State for the Environment in exercise of the powers conferred on him by section 11 of the Historic Buildings and Ancient Monuments Act 1953, has made a Preservation Order entitled the Chesterton Roman Town Preservation Order 1973 dated 21st March 1973 which comes into operation on 30th March 1973.

The effect of the Order is to put the Ancient Monument shown on the plan attached to the Order being part of Chesterton Roman Camp in the Parish of Chesterton and Kingston in the county of Warwick (in respect of which an Interim Preservation Notice served under section 10 of the said Act is in force) under the more lasting protection of the Secretary of State and to make provision for compensation to persons affected.

The Chesterton Roman Town Preservation Order 1973 is not subject to special parliamentary procedure.
