Long Ashton Rural District, Somerset (Footpath No. 21/2 at Yatton) Public Path Extinguishment Order, 1972

Notice is hereby given that on the 19th day of January 1973, the Somerset County Council confirmed the above-named Order.

The effect of the Order as confirmed is to extinguish that part of the footpath No. 21/2 at Yatton which runs from Biddle Street in a south-easterly and then easterly direction for approximately 85 yards.

SOUTHPORT COUNTY BOROUGH COUNCIL

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT, 1971

Lord Street Conservation Area

Notice is hereby given under section 277 of the above Act that the Southport County Borough Council has designated a Conservation Area, to be called the Lord Street Conservation Area, more particularly defined as follows:

Description

Lord Street is the main street of Southport, containing the major shopping area of the County Borough, as well as the main civic area and part of the major business district. It does not possess a single, overall character, rather it contains three areas of separate identity reflecting those uses mentioned above. The whole area is united by the visual uniformity created by the spaciousness of the street, the verandahs, the tree-lined boulevards and the intricacy of detail. The Street has an interesting history and possesses a variety of building styles and materials (seen in the wealth of "listed buildings") scale and use, overlaid with a richness and interest of architectural design, all combining to give it a visual quality and character of some repute.

Definition

The Lord Street Conservation Area is comprised of all those properties which front Lord Street and their adjoining

curtilages (except where stated) plus the following adjoining properties and curtilages:

On the seaward side of Lord Street:

The north-east quadrant of Duke Street, as far as and including, all Winter Gardens Terrace and the "Tudor Bar and Grill Room" plus that land lying between it and the Ribble Bus Station. Coronation Walk up to No. 15 (odd) and 8 (even). All Waverley Street and all Scarisbrick Avenue as far as West Street, (plus 38 and 44 West Street). All Burton Arcade properties. All properties south-east of Cable Street, plus Nevill Street and Bold Street, (both sides of each) as far as Stanley Street. All Seabank Road as far as Gordon Street. Also included are "Tower Buildings" (Leicester Street) and Sandringham Court.

On the landward side of Lord Street:

Manchester Road to No. 18 (even side only) and Union Street up to No. 18 (even) and No. 7 (odd). This block does not include the car park to the "Grand Casino". All property north-west of Castle Street and Anchor Street, (including 2-14 (even) and 1-3 (odd) Hill Street, and excepting 15-21 (odd) Anchor Street. London Street up to No. 12 (even) and No. 19 (odd). Property north-west of Sharrock Street. All property comprising the Cambridge Arcade. 9 to (but not including) 51 Chapel Street. Christ Church Secondary School. All property north-west of King Street and Nelson Street (including 47-51 Nelson Street). The south-east quadrant of Duke Street as far as (not including) the Masonic Hall. Also included are Lord Street Congregational Church and Hall.

Further information detailing the properties involved can be obtained from the offices of the Borough Architect and Town Planning Officer, 99-105 Lord Street, Southport, where a plan is available for viewing.
