The Derbyshire County Council (Brown Lane and Cross Lane, Dronfield) (One-way Traffic) Order, 1973

Notice is hereby given that the Derbyshire County Council propose to make an Order under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1967 as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act, 1968, the effect of which will be:

That no person shall cause any vehicle to proceed in the lengths of road in the Urban District of Dronfield known as Brown Lane and Cross Lane except in the directions given below.

Brown Lane; in an easterly and then south-easterly direction, i.e. from its junction with Eckington Road to its junction with Cross Lane.

Cross Lane; in a westerly direction, i.e. from its junction with Brown Lane to its junction with Green Lane.

A copy of the draft Order and a map showing the roads to which the proposed Order relates together with a statement of the Council's reasons for proposing to make the Order may be examined at the County Offices, Matlock (Room 109) and at the offices of the Dronfield Urban District Council, Dronfield between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. (Monday to Friday).

DEVON COUNTY COUNCIL

The County of Devon (Union Square and Abbey Road, Bovey Tracey) (Prohibition and Limitation of Waiting) Order, 1973

Notice is hereby given that the Devon County Council propose to make an Order under sections 1 (1), (2) and (3) and 84D (1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968.

In addition to the existing waiting restrictions in Union Square and Abbey Road, Bovey Tracey, when this Order comes into effect you will not be allowed to leave your vehicle between 9 a.m. and 6 p.m., Monday to Saturday, in the following lengths of Abbey Road:

- (i) north side, from its junction with Hind Street north-westwards for a distance of 50 yards;
- (ii) south side, from a point 63 yards west of the junction of Union Square and Fore Street north-westwards for a distance of 56 yards.

Exceptions will permit waiting for the purpose of:

- (a) picking up and setting down passengers;
- (b) loading or unloading goods;
- (c) collecting or delivering postal packets for the Post Office;

and, where necessary, in connection with:

- (d) the maintenance of the road, and
- (e) the supply of gas, electricity and water.

Full details of the proposal are in the draft Order which, together with a map showing the lengths of road in question and a statement of the Council's reasons for proposing to make the Order, may be examined during usual office hours, Monday to Friday, at the offices of the Newton Abbot Rural District Council, Kingsteignton Road, Newton Abbot, or at Room G.55b, County Hall, Exeter.

If you wish to object to the proposed Order, you must send the grounds for your objection in writing to the undersigned by 30th April 1973.

DEVON COUNTY COUNCIL

The County of Devon (Various Streets, Teignmouth) (Prohibition and Limitation of Waiting) (Amendment) Order, 1973.

Notice is hereby given that on 4th April 1973, the Devon County Council made an Order under sections 1 (1), (2) and (3) and 84D (1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act

1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968.

The effect of the Order is to alter the commencement date of the present seasonal waiting restrictions at Teignmouth from 1st April to 1st May each year.

The Order will come into operation on 7th April 1973.

A copy of the Order and a map showing the affected lengths of road may be inspected during normal office hours (Monday-Friday) at Room G.55b, County Hall, Exeter, or at the Urban District Council Offices, Bitton House, Teignmouth.

If you wish to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or of any instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order, you may, within 6 weeks from 4th April 1973 apply to the High Court for this purpose.

DONCASTER COUNTY BOROUGH COUNCIL

The County Borough of Doncaster (Victoria Road) (One-Way Traffic) Order 1973

Notice is hereby given that the Doncaster County Borough Council propose to make an Order under section 1 (1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968.

When this Order comes into effect you will not be allowed to proceed in a vehicle in that length of Victoria Road in the County Borough of Doncaster from its junction with Balby Road to a point 40 feet north-west of the said junction otherwise than in a direction from south-east to north-west.

DONCASTER COUNTY BOROUGH COUNCIL

The County Borough of Doncaster (Balby Road and Carr Hill) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1973

Notice is hereby given that the Doncaster County Borough Council propose to make an Order under section 1 (1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968.

When the Order comes into effect you will not be allowed to leave your vehicle at any time on the lengths of Balby Road and Carr Hill indicated in the Schedule to this notice.

Exceptions will permit waiting (*inter alia*):

- (i) For picking up and setting down passengers, loading and unloading of goods (except between the hours 7.30 a.m. to 9.30 a.m. and 4 p.m. to 6.30 p.m., Mondays to Fridays) and the collection and delivery of Post Office mail; and
- (ii) by certain classes of invalids.
