

of the Clean Air Act 1956 as modified by the Clean Air Act, 1968, on 18th April 1973, made an Order entitled "The Borough of Harrogate No. 3 (Valley Gardens) Smoke Control Order, 1973", declaring the area described in the Schedule hereto to be a smoke control area, which Order is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation.

Subject to the exemptions provided by the Order and by virtue of section 11 (4) of the Act if, on any day after the Order has come into operation, smoke is emitted from the chimney of any building within the smoke control area the occupier of that building shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding £20 unless he proves the emission of smoke was not caused by the use of any fuel other than authorised fuel. The authorised fuels include anthracite, coke and other carbonised fuels, gas and electricity. In addition, in accordance with section 9 of the Clean Air Act, 1968, any person who acquires or sells any solid fuel other than an authorised fuel for use in a building in the smoke control area shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding £20.

If confirmed, the Order will not come into operation before the 1st day of April 1974, or before a later date determined by the Secretary of State for the Environment.

Copies of the Order and of the map referred to therein may be inspected free of charge at the office of the Town Clerk, Municipal Offices, Harrogate, HG1 2SG, at all reasonable times during the period of 6 weeks from 5th May 1973.

Within the said period any person who will be affected by the Order may by notice in writing to the Secretary, Department of the Environment, 2 Marsham Street, London S.W.1, object to the confirmation of the Order.
